Bond Sale Completed to Fund 2014, 2011 Construction Projects

The City of Broken Arrow recently completed the sale of \$18,200,000 in General Obligation (GO) bonds. These funds will pay for capital improvement projects benefiting the entire community. Some of the improvements include widening 9th Street (Lynn Lane) from Flight Safety to Houston Street, in order to accommodate the increased traffic. Further street enhancements will continue in the Rose District from Dallas Street south to Houston Street. Also, a new Fire Station #3 will be constructed in south Broken Arrow.

“The City of Broken Arrow has a great track record of completing bond projects that citizens voted for, and we want to keep it that way,” said City Manager Michael Spurgeon. “City staff will be working diligently to get bids out to contractors and then put projects on a construction schedule as quickly as possible to get things moving in 2016.”

The 2016 GO Bond sale will not increase the ad valorem rate which is used to calculate property taxes. The City is able to keep the ad valorem rate the same by issuing new bonds as old bonds are paid off.
