


## **Old Fire Station on South Elm Reopens**

The City of Broken Arrow announces the temporary reopening of an old fire station, located at 2900 S. Elm Place, which closed in 2012 after a new fire station was built to replace it. In December 2012, all personnel and equipment from the old fire station on Elm moved to the new location at 2300 West Norfolk Drive, now known as Fire Station

Number (No.) 2.

Over time, as the City's population has grown, the Broken Arrow Fire Department's calls for response have also increased. In an effort to minimize response times in the south part of Broken Arrow, the City will reopen the old fire station on January 19, 2016. The facility will remain open until the construction of Fire Station No. 3 is completed. The City is currently in the process of acquiring land for a new Fire Station No. 3, which will be located in the southeast part of Broken Arrow.

"The reopening of the old fire station, which will be our seventh fire station, will help our first responders get to citizens faster," said Fire Chief Jeremy Moore. "Thanks to voter approval to renew



The old fire station on Elm Place will initially be staffed by three firefighters with an Advanced Life Support Fire Engine. An ambulance will be added as staffing and other apparatus become available.





All businesses on Hillside Drive between 9th Street and Albany Street remain open, despite the partial road closure. Detour signs have been posted on Hillside Drive, so drivers will know how to access businesses in the area.

On December 29, 2015, a portion of Hillside Drive between 9th Street and Albany Street was closed due to safety concerns. Specifically, the partial road closure affects Hillside Drive from the Charleston's parking lot east to the Sprout's parking lot. The City of Broken Arrow is evaluating the integrity of the retaining wall along the roadway, which may have been affected by the recent heavy rainfall.

The City is meeting with the general contractor and the design engineer who worked on the construction project, to evaluate the project and determine any necessary remediation. The project first began in November 2013 and was completed in May 2014. Further updates will be provided after the City completes its analysis and meetings with contractors.

### **Tornado Season Means Audible Weather Siren Testing in BA**

The City of Broken Arrow's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) will audibly test its weather sirens on the first Monday of every month from March until June, weather permitting. If it is cloudy or severe weather is in the area, sirens will sound the following Wednesday.

The EOC conducts silent testing every Monday throughout the year. However, audible testing is conducted during storm season, March through June. Make sure your family discusses where you will go to seek shelter during a tornado or other severe weather event. Developing a family communications plan is an important part of emergency planning. If you haven't assembled an emergency kit, now is the time to put one together.

It's important to monitor local weather reports via television, radio or a weather radio, when you know that severe weather is approaching. Remember, A TORNADO WATCH means tornadoes are possible. A TORNADO WARNING means a tornado has been sighted. When a TORNADO WARNING is issued, take shelter in a basement, away from windows. If there is no basement, go to an interior room, like a closet, on the ground floor.
