The City of Broken Arrow has launched a new digital service that makes it easy to report non-emergency issues such as potholes, streetlight outages, and other concerns through your mobile device or computer. You can take photos of the problem, submit it electronically, and get updates when the item has been logged, assigned to a staff member and closed out. The application can be accessed online via a mobile device or a computer. More convenient than calling, this method also gives citizens an opportunity to track their issue and verify the work has been completed. Keep Streets and Storm Sewers Free of Leaves

It's that time of year when property owners find themselves inundated by fall leaves. Remember to properly dispose of your leaves by bagging, mulching or composting. Do not blow or rake leaves into the street or storm sewers. Not only is it a violation of City of Broken Arrow code, but storm sewers clogged with leaves, grass clippings and other debris create flooding hazards.

Section 12-6 of the Code of Ordinances addresses unlawful deposits:

"It shall be unlawful for any person to throw, sweep or otherwise deposit, into or upon the streets, alleys, parkings, sidewalks or other public places of the city, any garbage, trash, paper, rubbish,

grass, weeds, tree trimmings, dirt, crates, boxes or other refuse of any kind. It shall likewise be unlawful for any person to deposit any garbage, trash or other refuse upon private property, whether owned by such person or not, within the limits of the city, unless the same shall be enclosed in a suitable container"

The City's Sanitation Division will remove up to ten 30-gallon size or smaller bags during regular trash pickup at no additional cost. Each additional bag beyond ten will be charged \$1.25 per bag. (Note: Bags sized over 30 gallons are counted as two bags.)
