PROPOSITION NUMBER 1

“Shall the City of Broken Arrow, State of Oklahoma, incur an indebtedness by issuing its bonds in one or more series in an amount not to exceed the sum of One Hundred Forty Two Million Six Hundred Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$142,625,000) pursuant to Article 10, Section 27 of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma to provide funds for the purpose of constructing, reconstructing and repairing streets and levy and collect an annual tax, in addition to all other taxes, upon all the taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as it falls due, and also to constitute a sinking fund for the payment of the principal thereof when due, said bonds to bear interest at not to exceed the rate of ten percent (10%) per annum, payable semiannually and to become due serially within twenty (20) years from their date?”

(A) The specific projects for which at least 70% of the proceeds of the aforesaid street improvement bonds subject of Proposition Number 1 shall be expended and the dollar amounts for each project shall be as follows:

Widen Houston Street (81st Street South) from 9th Street (Lynn Lane) to Old Highway 51, including engineering, design, construction of required appurtenances and acquisition of easements and right-of-way. \$7,400,000

Widen Houston Street (81st Street South) from Garnett Road (113th East Avenue) to Olive Avenue (129th East Avenue), including engineering, design, construction of required appurtenances and acquisition of easements and right-of-way. \$5,900,000

Widen Houston Street (81st Street South) from Olive Avenue (129th East Avenue) to Aspen Avenue (145th East Avenue), including engineering, design, construction of required appurtenances and acquisition of easements and right-of-way \$4,600,000

Widen Washington Street (91st Street South) from Olive Avenue (129th East Avenue) to Aspen Avenue (145th East Avenue), including engineering, design, construction of required appurtenances and acquisition of easements and right-of-way. \$4,700,000

Construct improvements to the intersection Washington Street (91st Street South) and Aspen Avenue (145th East Avenue), including engineering, design and construction of required appurtenances and acquisition of easements and right-of-away. \$2,200,000

Widen Washington Street (91st Street South) from 9th Street (Lynn Lane) to 23rd Street (County Line Road), including engineering, design, construction of required appurtenances and acquisition of easements and right-of-way. \$5,200,000

Resurface Tucson Street (121st East Avenue) from 1st Street to 5th Street, including engineering, design, construction of required appurtenances and acquisition of easements and right-of-way. \$ 800,000

Resurface Aspen Avenue (145th East Avenue) from Albany Street (61st Street South) to Kenosha Street (71st Street South), including engineering, design, construction of required appurtenances and acquisition of easements and right-of-way. \$2,000,000

Widen Aspen Avenue (145th East Avenue) from Tucson Street (121st East Avenue) to West Shreveport Street, including engineering, design, construction of required appurtenances and acquisition of easements and right-of-way. \$7,500,000

Widen Elm Place (161st East Avenue) from Kenosha Street (71st Street South) to State Highway 51 (Broken Arrow Expressway), including engineering, design, construction of required appurtenances and acquisition of easements and right-of-way. \$6,400,000

Construct improvements to the intersection at Elm Place (161st East Avenue) and New Orleans Street (101st Street South), including engineering, design, construction of required appurtenances and acquisition of easements and right-of-way. \$ 600,000

Construct improvements to the intersection at 9th Street (Lynn Lane) and Kenosha Street (71st Street South), including engineering, design, installation of required appurtenances, milling of

asphalt, laying new asphalt as required. \$2,200,000

Construct improvements to the intersection at 9th Street (Lynn Lane) and Hillside Drive, including engineering, design, installation of required appurtenances, milling of asphalt and laying new asphalt as required. \$1,900,000

Widen 9th Street (Lynn Lane) from Houston Street (81st Street South) to Washington Street (91st Street South), including engineering, design, construction of required appurtenances and acquisition of easements and right-of-way. \$5,200,000

Widen 9th Street (Lynn Lane) from Washington Street (91st Street South) to New Orleans Street (101st Street South), including engineering, design, construction of required appurtenances and acquisition of easements and right-of-way. \$5,200,000

Widen 23rd Street (County Line) from Omaha Street (51st Street South) to Albany Street (61st Street South), including engineering, design, construction of required appurtenances and acquisition of easements and right-of-way. \$5,000,000

Construct bridge replacement on 23rd Street (County Line) between Omaha Street (51st Street South) and Albany Street (61st Street South), including engineering, design and construction of required appurtenances. \$4,100,000

Widen 37th Street (209th East Avenue) from Dearborn Street (41st Street South) to Omaha Street (51st Street South), including engineering, design, construction of required appurtenances and acquisition of easements and right-of-way. \$5,300,000

Rehabilitate and/or resurface various residential streets located throughout the city. Rehabilitation work may include reconstruction, mill and overlay, patching, engineering, right-of-way and design. \$25,000,000

PROPOSITION NUMBER 2

“Shall the City of Broken Arrow, State of Oklahoma, incur an indebtedness by issuing its bonds in one or more series in an amount not to exceed the sum of Twenty Million Three Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$20,350,000) pursuant to Article 10, Section 27 of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma to provide funds for the purpose of purchasing, constructing, and repairing public safety utilities to be owned exclusively by said City, and levy and collect an annual tax, in addition to all other taxes, upon all the taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as it falls due, and also to constitute a sinking fund for the

payment of the principal thereof when due, said bonds to bear interest at not to exceed the rate of ten percent (10%) per annum, payable semiannually and to become due serially within twenty (20) years from their date?"

(B) The specific projects for which at least 70% of the proceeds of the aforesaid public safety facilities bonds subject of Proposition Number 2 shall be expended and the dollar amounts for each project shall be as follows:

Acquisition, construction, equipping and furnishing of a new fire station, located at Washington Street (91st Street South) and South 1st Place, for replacement of Fire Station No. 7. \$4,500,000

Construction, renovation, equipping and furnishing of fire department improvements to the Police and Fire Training Center Facility located at 4205 East Omaha Street. \$1,000,000

Acquisition and equipping of fire truck(s) and/or ambulance(s). \$5,000,000

Expansion, renovation, equipping and furnishing of the existing Broken Arrow Police Department Jail, 2304 South 1st Place. \$3,250,000

Acquisition, replacement, construction and renovation of city wide civil defense sirens. \$600,000

Design, engineering and resurfacing of parking lot at the Public Safety Complex, located at 1101 North 6th Street, Broken Arrow, Oklahoma. \$500,000

PROPOSITION NUMBER 3

“Shall the City of Broken Arrow, State of Oklahoma, incur an indebtedness by issuing its bonds in one or more series in an amount not to exceed the sum of Seventeen Million Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$17,750,000) pursuant to Article 10, Section 27 of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma to provide funds for the purpose of purchasing, constructing and repairing parks and recreation facilities to be owned exclusively by said City, and levy and collect an annual tax, in addition to all other taxes, upon all the taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as it falls due, and also to constitute a sinking fund for the payment of the principal thereof when due, said bonds to bear interest at not to exceed the rate of ten percent (10%) per annum, payable semiannually and to become due serially within twenty (20) years from their date?”

(C) The specific projects for which at least 70% of the proceeds of the aforesaid parks and recreation bonds subject of Proposition Number 3 shall be expended and dollar amounts for each project shall be as follows:

Improvements to Indian Springs Sports Complex near Jasper Street (131 st Street South) and Aspen Avenue (145 th East Avenue) including installation of synthetic turf on the soccer fields.	\$3,000,000

PROPOSITION NUMBER 4

“Shall the City of Broken Arrow, State of Oklahoma, incur an indebtedness by issuing its bonds in one or more series in an amount not to exceed the sum of Sixteen Million Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$16,800,000) pursuant to Article 10, Section 27 of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma to provide funds for the purpose of purchasing land and constructing, furnishing and equipping public buildings and facilities to be owned exclusively by said City, and levy and collect an annual tax, in addition to all other taxes, upon all the taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as it falls due, and also to constitute a sinking fund for the payment of the principal thereof when due, said bonds to bear interest at not to exceed the rate of ten percent (10%) per annum, payable semiannually and to become due serially within twenty (20) years from their date

(D) The specific projects for which at least 70% of the proceeds of the aforesaid land purchase and public building and facilities bonds subject of Proposition Number 4 shall be expended and dollar amounts for each project shall be as follows:

Construction and renovations to the city maintenance facilities located at 1700 West Detroit Street. \$3,000,000

Construction and renovations to city maintenance facilities at 2302 South 1st Place and possible acquisition of the adjacent properties thereto, including renovations to the maintenance garage, storage facility and secondary access. \$2,000,000

Construct an Armed Forces Meeting Hall near Veteran’s Park in downtown area, including architectural/engineering design, acquisition of necessary land and construction of necessary infrastructure, including water and sewer lines, roads and parking. \$2,000,000

Construct a new Senior Center meeting/activity center located in the downtown area, including architectural/engineering design, acquisition of necessary land and construction of necessary infrastructure, including water and sewer lines, roads and parking. \$3,500,000

Acquisition of land for additional Senior Center and improvements to serve Senior Citizens Center and Arrowhead Park Located in the downtown area. \$1,300,000

PROPOSITION NUMBER 5

“Shall the City of Broken Arrow, State of Oklahoma, incur an indebtedness by issuing its bonds in one or more series in an amount not to exceed the sum of Seven Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$7,500,000) pursuant to Article 10, Section 27 of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma to provide funds for the purpose of constructing, reconstructing and repairing stormwater facilities to be owned exclusively by said City, and levy and collect an annual tax, in addition to all other taxes, upon all the taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as it falls due, and also to constitute a sinking fund for the payment of the principal thereof when due, said bonds to bear interest at not to exceed the rate of ten percent (10%) per annum, payable semiannually and to become due serially within twenty (20) years from their date?”

(E) The specific projects for which at least 70% of the proceeds of the aforesaid stormwater facilities bonds subject of Proposition Number 5 shall be expended and dollar amounts for each project shall be as follows:

Drainage improvements in the vicinity of Stone Ridge Towne Center located at Albany Street (61st Street South) and State Highway 51 (Broken Arrow Expressway). \$3,000,000

Drainage improvements in the vicinity of Village Square II & Vandever Acres, near Washington Street (91st Street South) and Elm Place (161 E. Avenue), including upgrading the stormwater conveyance system and necessary design, acquisition of right-of-way, and construction of necessary utilities. \$400,000

Drainage and channelization improvements in the vicinity of Indian Springs, near Jasper Street (131st Street South) and Aspen Avenue (145th E. Avenue), including upgrades to the culvert and conveyance system, including necessary engineering and design. \$600,000

Drainage improvements in the vicinity of Arrowwood Estates, near 115th Street South and 23rd Street (County Line Road). \$500,000

Drainage improvements in the vicinity of the Lancaster Park Detention Facility located near Kenosha Street (71st Street South) and Garnett Road (113th E. Avenue). \$500,000

Drainage improvements in the vicinity of Tiger Creek Nature Park and Tiger Creek floodplain improvements located near Albany Street (61st Street South) between 9th Street (Lynn Lane) and 23rd Street (County Line Road). \$500,000

“Shall the City of Broken Arrow, State of Oklahoma, incur an indebtedness by issuing its bonds in one or more series in an amount not to exceed the sum of Five Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$5,500,000) pursuant to Article 10, Section 26 of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma to provide funds for the purpose of drainage improvements to property owned exclusively or in part by said City and levy and collect an annual tax, in addition to all other taxes, upon all the taxable property in said City sufficient to pay the interest on said bonds as it falls due, and also to constitute a sinking fund for the payment of the principal thereof when due, said bonds to bear interest at not to exceed the rate of ten percent (10%) per annum, payable semiannually and to become due serially Within twenty (20) years from their date?”

(F) The specific projects for which at least 70% of the proceeds of the aforesaid drainage improvement bonds subject of Proposition Number 6 shall be expended and dollar amounts for each project shall be as follows:

Drainage improvements in Adams Creek Basin-channelization, bank stabilization, detention, clearing of drainageway. \$1,000,000

Drainage improvements in Broken Arrow Creek Basin- channelization, bank stabilization, detention, clearing of drainageway. \$1,000,000

Drainage improvements in Haikey Creek Basin- Channelization, bank stabilization, detention, clearing of drainageway. \$1,000,000

Drainage improvements in Elm or Aspen Creek Basin- Channelization, bank stabilization, detention, clearing of drainageway. \$850,000
