Snow and Ice Control

The Streets and Stormwater Department responded to the freezing rain event that occurred on January 2, 2019. At approximately 7:30 p.m., the department dispersed a crew of seven individuals, utilizing 77 personnel hours and 25 tons of salt to pre-treat bridges, overpasses, and to address random slick spots. As temperatures began to increase, precipitation evolved from freezing rain to rain for most of the day January 3rd. With anticipated falling temperatures in the evening hours of January 3rd and overnight into the morning hours of January 4th, the Streets and Stormwater Department deployed a crew of seven individuals to monitor bridges, overpasses and potential areas for ice to develop. Personnel reported at 8:00 p.m. on Thursday January 3, 2019 and worked through 4:00 a.m. on Friday January 4, 2019. For this effort, 56 personnel hours were utilized. No significant ice event ever materialized.
