Floor furnace suspected cause of deadly fire at Broken Arrow home

Broken Arrow, Okla. (3/5/2019) – On March 4, 2019, at approximately 11:46 a.m., the Broken Arrow

Police and Fire were dispatched to a house fire in the 500 block of West Elgin Street. The initial caller

stated dark smoke was coming from the roof of the house and attempts to contact the occupants were

unsuccessful.

Upon arrival, the Broken Arrow Fire Department (BAFD), began primary search and rescue efforts, as well

as fire suppression operations. The primary search located two juveniles who were immediately removed

from the residence. BAFD Firefighter/Paramedics performed life saving measures enroute to the hospital.

Despite resuscitative efforts, the children were pronounced deceased shortly after arrival at the hospital.

Also during the search, one adult male was found and pronounced dead at the scene.

The fire investigation is on-going, however, the Broken Arrow Fire Department suspects the cause of the

fire to be from combustible materials coming into contact with a floor furnace. It was also discovered that

there were no working smoke detectors inside the residence.

Any death unattended by a physician is investigated by the Broken Arrow Police Department (BAPD).

BAPD detectives and Crime Scene Investigators conducted the death investigation. The Oklahoma State

Medical Examiner's Office will conduct an investigation and ultimately determine the cause and manner

of death.

At this time, we are still awaiting positive identification of the victims.

FEMA approves Broken Arrow storm shelter rebate program

Grants will offset cost of installation for 164 homeowners

Broken Arrow, Okla. (3/6/2019) – The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has awarded a grant worth \$328,000 to the City of Broken Arrow. These funds will offset the cost of installing storm shelters for 164 homeowners.

"This is very exciting, that we have federal tax dollars coming back into our community to help save lives," said City Manager Michael Spurgeon. "We hope to continue participating in this program in the future to allow more residents the opportunity to take advantage of the rebate."

The City of Broken Arrow received more than 300 applications last October, when it held two meetings to announce details of the Safe Room Rebate Program, which is managed by the Oklahoma Department of Emergency Management (OEM). The program allows homeowners who would like to install a safe room the chance to earn a rebate of up to \$2,000. Qualifying residents must own their own home, live in the city limits and not be located in a flood zone.

The City will begin contacting homeowners who were approved for a grant. They are required to attend another meeting to get instructions for receiving their rebate check. The meetings will be held on March 28 and April 2 at 7:00 p.m. at the Public Safety Complex, 1101 N. 6th Street. Attendance at only one meeting is required.

Broken Arrow firefighters check, hand out smoke detectors

BAFD reminds residents to change batteries at daylight savings time change

Broken Arrow, Okla. (3/8/2019) – The Broken Arrow Fire Department will conduct smoke detector checks from 1-3 p.m., Saturday, March 9.

Firefighters will walk door-to-door near the Rose District to remind citizens that daylight savings time is the perfect opportunity to make sure the batteries in their smoke detectors are operational.

The firefighters will distribute batteries to residents who may need them. They will also install new smoke detectors for any home requesting them.

The Broken Arrow Fire Department offers one free smoke detector per home to anyone that needs one. Residents may call the Fire Department Administration Headquarters at 918-259-8360 to request a smoke detector. Once contact information is collected, fire department personnel will deliver the battery-operated detector to the resident's home.
