Mayor signs Emergency Declaration for City of Broken Arrow

Broken Arrow, Okla. (5/23/19) - The City of Broken Arrow has issued an Emergency

Declaration due to flooding, caused by the recent intense rainfall and historic outflow from

Keystone Dam. The proclamation is effective immediately and applies specifically to the area

south of Jasper (131st) Street between Garnett Road to 23rd Street (County Line Road).

The proclamation also prohibits non-residents from the area declared as an emergency. This

provision was included in the proclamation due to police concerns regarding potential looting in

the emergency area.

A voluntary evacuation is advised. Property within the 100 year floodplain is at the greatest risk.

Residents in affected areas are advised to gather a multi-day supply of clothing, food,

medications, as well as pets (with supplies for them as well) and leave the area. Other tips

include:

• Bring pets with you (include supplies for them as well)

• Place valuables up high

Charge cell phones

• Take video or pictures of your home for insurance purposes.

Once evacuated, residents may not be able to enter evacuated areas.

Sand bags have also been made available for residents in potential flood zones. Sand and bags are available at the Liberty Trail parking lot on the east side of Elm Place near the Creek Turnpike. Entry to the trailhead is off Miami Street. Residents will need to fill their own sand bags using their own shovels. Tools are NOT provided.

PROCLAMATION BY CRAIG THURMOND, MAYOR OF THE CITY OF BROKEN ARROW, OF AN EMERGENCY IN THE CITY OF BROKEN ARROW DUE TO FLOODING

WHEREAS, Chapter 20, Section 20.3 of the City of Broken Arrow Code of Ordinances and Title 21 Section 1321.1 et al. of the Oklahoma Statutes empowers the Mayor of the City of Broken Arrow to proclaim a state of emergency when the City of Broken Arrow is threatened by a local emergency that affects the life, health, property or the public peace and:

WHEREAS, Craig Thurmond, the Mayor of the City of Broken Arrow does hereby find that conditions affecting public order, life, health, property or the public peace have arisen within the City of Broken Arrow caused by the intense rainfall, the outflow from Keystone Dame being its highest level in the last twenty-four (24) years and subsequent flooding of the City of Broken Arrow;

NOW THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED that a local emergency now exists in the City of Broken Arrow, State of Oklahoma, in the area South of 131st Street (Jasper) between Garnett to 193rd Street (County Line); and

IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that the Mayor of the City of Broken Arrow is empowered to evoke the powers enumerated in Chapter 20, Section 20.4 of the City of Broken Arrow Code of Ordinances; and

IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that non-residents of the area declared as an emergency described above are prohibited from assembling or gathering on the public streets, parks or other areas in the designated emergency area; and

IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that this state of emergency shall continue until the issuance of a proclamation of the Mayor declaring its termination.

BAFD releases video showing why drivers should avoid flooded roads

Dramatic video shows the swift water rescue of a stranded motorist

Broken Arrow, Okla. (5/21/2019) – The Broken Arrow Fire Department (BAFD) today released video footage from a swift-water rescue operation, advising the public about the importance avoiding flooded roads.

At approximately 2:19 a.m. today, BAFD was dispatched to 6600 E. Albany St. in northeast Broken Arrow in response to a vehicle that had been swept off the roadway by fast-moving water. When firefighters arrived on scene, they found an adult male clinging to a fence post and unable to escape the raging water.

After quickly evaluating the scene and potential hazards, firefighter Robert Goode, assisted by Acting Captain Branson Phillips, deployed a life safety rope to the stranded victim and entered the water to make their way across the current. Goode was then able to deploy a floatation device to the victim. After the victim put on the floatation device, Goode assisted him back across the current to safety.

The victim was transported to the hospital in stable condition. While receiving medical attention, the victim reported that he had been clinging to the post for nearly five hours before a passerby heard his cry for help and called 911.

"This scene was a particularly dangerous situation and the swift action of all responders ensured the victim was rescued in a short amount of time," said BAFD Chief Jeremy Moore. "This incident is a sharp reminder of the dangers associated with driving into water on the roadway – it is impossible to determine how deep the water is. Remember: Turn Around; Don't Drown."

BAFD units that responded to the incident included Engine 4, Ladder 1, Ladder 6, Squad 4, Battalion Chief and Brush Truck 2.

Severe Weather Response

The Streets and Stormwater Department responded to a severe weather event that occurred on May 20, 2019. At approximately 9:30 pm., the Streets and Stormwater Department dispersed a crew of nine (9) individuals, utilizing 90 personnel hours. Seven (7) trucks were out monitoring the radio, and responding to down trees, patching the washout on bridges, and flood control. On May 21, twenty-three (23) personnel worked from 6:00 am. -4:30 pm. utilizing 230 hours. Crews removed tree and debris from roadways. All flooded roads were opened by 2pm.






And Then They Came for Me: Remembering the World of Anne Frank by James Still March 20-29. 2020
