Definitions

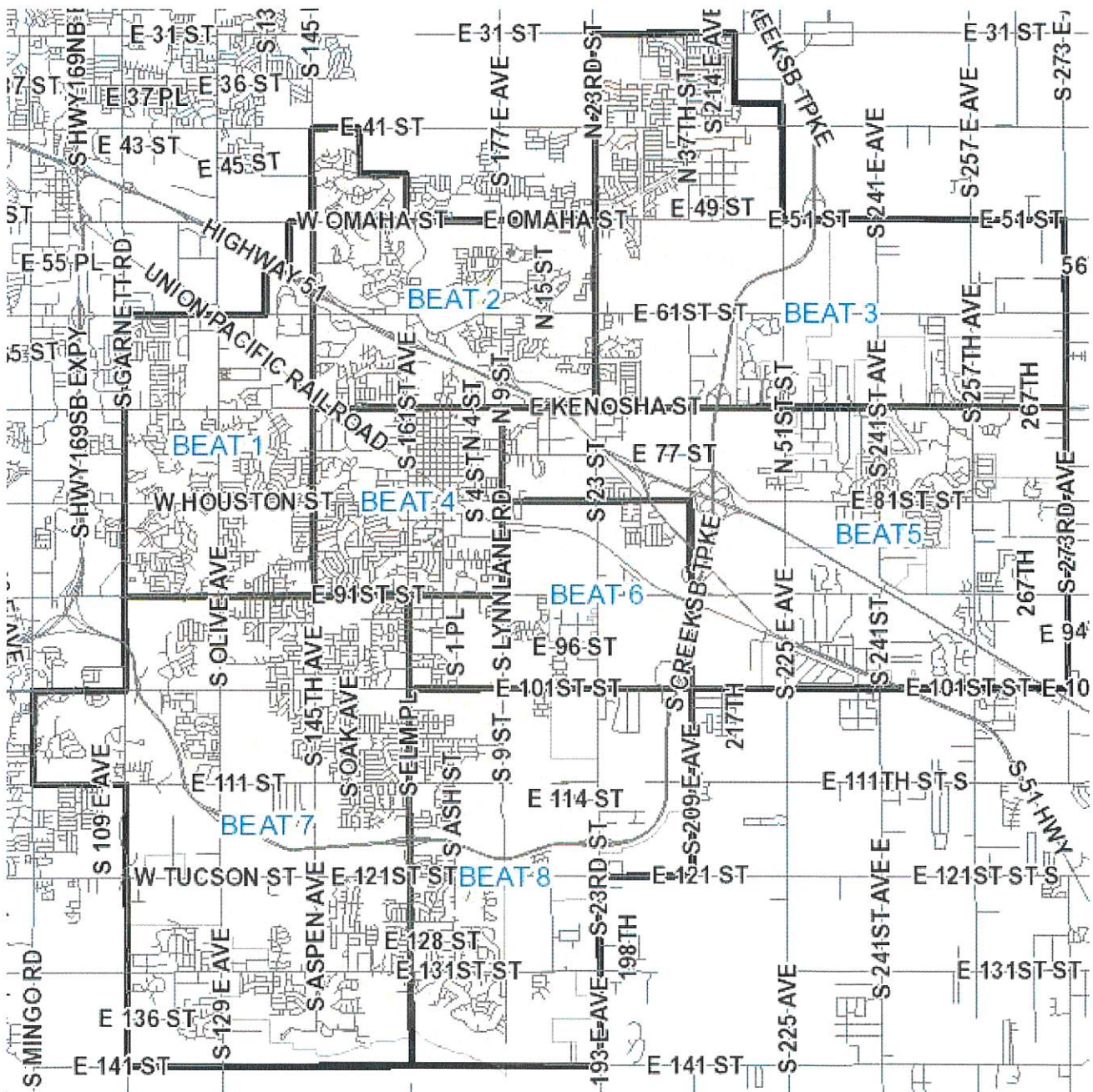
- Priority 1 =** Crimes in progress involving life threatening circumstances and situations that produce or are likely to produce serious bodily injury or death to any person.
- Priority 2 =** Crimes in progress or that have just occurred, incidents in progress that present the potential for injury or property damage/loss, situations where the suspect is still at the scene or in the area and will elude apprehension or create the potential for injury or property damage if the police do not arrive rapidly, incidents where an officer is needed to secure a scene or witnesses, and incidents where there is a need for crowd control or traffic control which, if not done immediately, would create the imminent potential for injury or property damage/loss.
- Priority 3 =** Crimes against people that are misdemeanors in progress or that have just occurred, reports of recent felony crimes, suspicious circumstances with no threat of injury, and incidents that do not require an officer immediately, but need investigation, mediation, or intervention.
- Priority 4 =** Property or service-related calls for an officer to respond that cannot be handled by telephone, misdemeanor reports when caller demands officer or when an officer needs to investigate the scene or interview witnesses, and requests for officers that do not require a quick response.



Broken Arrow Police Department September 2019 Calls For Service



- Priority 5 =** Primarily officer-initiated calls or ten-codes used for in-house purposes.
- Priority 6 =** Calls for Animal Control Officer response.
- Priority 7 =** Calls for Standby Public Works services, i.e., water, sewer, streets, electrician, etc.



*Total call and self-initiated call amounts include priority 7 calls.

Background:

The Broken Arrow Fire Department (BAFD) is teaming up with the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) to promote this year's Fire Prevention Week campaign "Not Every Hero Wears a Cape. Plan and Practice Your Escape!" The campaign works to educate everyone about the small but important actions they can take to keep themselves and those around them safe.

NFPA statistics show that in 2017 U.S. fire departments responded to 357,000 home structure fires. These fires caused 2,630 deaths and 10,600 injuries. From 2012 to 2016, an average of seven people per day died in home fires.

"These numbers show that home fires continue to pose a significant threat to safety," said Lorraine Carli, NFPA's vice president of Outreach and Advocacy. "In a typical home fire, you may have as little as one to two minutes to escape safely from the time the smoke alarm sounds. Escape planning and practice can help you make the most of the time you have, giving everyone enough time to get out."

NFPA has sponsored Fire Prevention Week for more than 90 years.

While NFPA and the BAFD are focusing on home fires, these messages apply to virtually any location.

BAFD is hosting a series of events in support of this year's Fire Prevention Week campaign. Events include the annual 3rd Grade poster contest, as well as visits to various elementary schools to teach children about fire safety.

Dear Local Franchising Authority,

The following channel changes will occur for Cox Communications and Cox Business customers on, or after, October 16, 2019, Zona Futbol HD will launch to Sports Pak 2 on channel 1323 (and channel 323 on Contour) and TUDN will be added to Sports Pak 2 on channels 374, 725, 1374 and 1725.

On November 1, 2019 ESPN Classic, on channels 304 and 1304 will no longer be available on our TV lineup.

On November 13, 2019, Newsmax HD will launch to TV Essential on channel 1473 (and channel 473 on Contour & mini box). Rai Italia will launch on channel 411 and requires a separate subscription.

Lastly, on December 31, 2019, Fuse on channels 221 and 1221 will no longer be available on our TV lineup and Music Choice Play, on channel 220 and 1220, will be discontinued by the content provider.

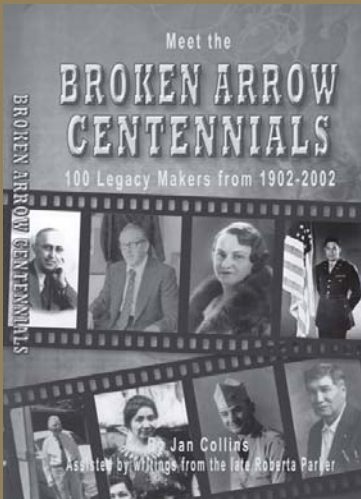

"The Broken Arrow Townsite was surveyed and platted by Samuel A. Cobb, a civil engineer with the Townsite Department of the Indian Office in Muskogee. The townsite plat consisted of 220 acres of land laid out in a north-south and east-west direction on either side of the proposed KATY Railroad track, which would later intersect the townsite at a 45 degree angle." -Don Wise

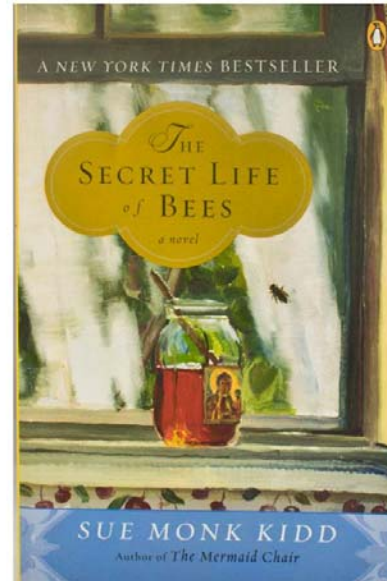

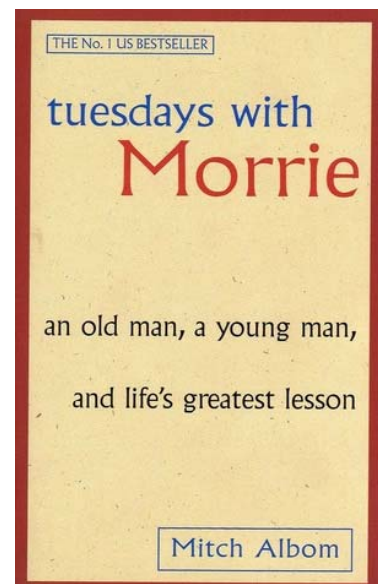
