VP of Economic Development visited Charlotte, Greenville, and Columbia with Christie Myers, Oklahoma Department of Commerce; Dave Stewart, MidAmerica Industrial Park; Chelsea Levo, City of Owasso; and Eric Miller, Muskogee City-County Port for scheduled appointments with key consultants in the region. Over the course of four days, the group hosted 11 meetings, with a total of 22 consultants. The group received two project leads, with the potential for an additional two project leads. A key theme throughout the visit included the growing focus on Foreign Direct Investment (particularly from Germany).
