City of Broken Arrow Names Assistant City Manager of Administration

Broken Arrow, Okla. (6/21/2016) – Russell Gale, long-time Human Resources Director for the City of Broken Arrow, has been promoted to Assistant City Manager of Administration. Gale will oversee the administrative division of the organization, which includes the following departments: Finance, General Services, Human Resources, City Clerk, Municipal Clerk and Information Technology.

"I look forward to working with City Manager Michael Spurgeon and the management team in advancing Broken Arrow to a greater level," said Gale. "I have always felt fortunate to serve in a city as creative and successful as Broken Arrow, and I am very appreciative of this opportunity that the City Manager has extended to me."

Gale's career with the City began in 1978, working as the Administrative Assistant to the City Manager. Two years later, he became the City's first Human Resources Director, responsible for employee recruitment and certification, administration of city-wide training programs, collective bargaining, and payroll administration. The City Council has twice appointed him Acting City Manager in the past four years, during which time he increased franchise taxes, initiated LifeRide, an ambulance subscription service that has reduced the operating deficit of the emergency medical services division, and was instrumental in developing an action plan to capture the retiring Vision 2025 sales tax for both operational and capital projects. Gale holds a Bachelor's degree in Political Science from Oklahoma State University.

"Russell Gale has a distinguished 35-plus year career with the City. Having served as Interim City Manager on two separate occasions, coupled with his detailed knowledge of City operations and affairs, I can't think of a more qualified individual to work as the Assistant City Manager over the Administration Division," said City Manager Michael Spurgeon. "Russell is a Broken Arrow native, a straight-shooter, and someone who is well respected within the community. The relationships and respect he has built over three decades will serve our citizens and businesses well."

Gale's appointment as Assistant City Manager of Administration is effective immediately. The City will begin recruiting for a Human Resources Director in July.

Rose District Landscape Changing with Demo of Former Church Building Demolition starts June 23

Broken Arrow, Okla. (6/21/2016) – Contractors for the City of Broken Arrow will begin demolition of the old Assembly of God Church on the morning of Thursday, June 23. The removal of the former church building at 305 N. Main Street will expand the Rose District north and open up room for additional retail, business, and residential space.

"Anyone visiting the Rose District can see there's a lot of excitement and momentum surrounding downtown Broken Arrow," said City Manager Michael Spurgeon. "The demolition of the vacant church building will clear the way for an entire city block to be developed into another great addition to the Rose District."

The Broken Arrow Economic Development Corporation is currently reviewing mixed-use project proposals from developers. The former church has been vacant since 2006. In February of this year, the City purchased the building for \$600,000.

ABOUT THE ROSE DISTRICT

The Rose District is an arts and entertainment district located on Main Street in Broken Arrow. It is quickly becoming a go-to destination for unique dining, handcrafted gifts, antiques, artisanal goods, jewelry, boutique clothing and world class entertainment at the Broken Arrow Performing Arts Center. Contractors are currently constructing an interactive water feature at the Rose District Pavilion, which is scheduled to open later this summer.

Since 2010, the City has sunk nearly \$10 million into infrastructure improvements on Main Street and the surrounding area. The private sector has responded with nearly \$30 million of investment, creating hundreds of jobs and opportunities to shop local. Learn more at www.rosedistrict.com.

Broken Arrow High School Class Reunion will be hosting an event at Central Park, **June 24th**, from 7:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. This event is open to Broken Arrow High School graduates from 1970 to 1979. They will have music, food and activities. This event is catered and will be serving low point beer. No road closures are required. We will be providing barricades to designate the area as a private event.

Tulsa Home School Expo will be hosting an annual event to raise funds for homeschooling families in need of financial assistance. This event will showcase curriculum vendors and speakers/presentations from local, out of state and young entrepreneurs. The event will be held at Northside Christian Church on **June 24**th and 25th from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. No road closures or city services requested.

Rockets Over Rhema will be hosting their annual event June 26th at Rhema Bible College on Kenosha. Festivities planned for this year include music, lots of food, fireworks and of course lots of fun. Each year over 50,000 citizens enjoy the family fun atmosphere of the event. Road closures will include Kenosha from Aspen Avenue to Elm Place and various side streets. Though this is an Independence Day event, they will not be discharging fireworks. Luther Drive (private street) immediately in front of the church will be closed to ensure safety of participants. Hidden Springs Block Party will be hosted by Jasper and Andrea Hinkle on **July 3rd** beginning at 4:00 p.m. This block party is a fundraiser for neighborhood resident, Caleb Anderson (age 6) who is suffering from cancer.
