
Definitions

- Priority 1 = Crimes in progress involving life threatening circumstances and situations that produce or are likely to produce serious bodily injury or death to any person.
- Priority 2 = Crimes in progress or that have just occurred, incidents in progress that present the potential for injury or property damage/loss, situations where the suspect is still at the scene or in the area and will elude apprehension or create the potential for injury or property damage if the police do not arrive rapidly, incidents where an officer is needed to secure a scene or witnesses, and incidents where there is a need for crowd control or traffic control which, if not done immediately, would create the imminent potential for injury or property damage/loss.
- **Priority 3** = Crimes against people that are misdemeanors in progress or that have just occurred, reports of recent felony crimes, suspicious circumstances with no threat of injury, and incidents that do not require an officer immediately, but need investigation, mediation, or intervention.
- Priority 4 = Property or service related calls for an officer to respond that cannot be handled by telephone, misdemeanor reports when caller demands officer or when an officer needs to investigate the scene or interview witnesses, and requests for officers that do not require a quick response.
- Priority 5 = Primarily Officer initiated calls or ten codes used for in-house purposes.

City Crews Cleaning Up After Storm Damage

Broken Arrow, Okla. (7/14/2016) – The City of Broken Arrow is advising residents to stay away from downed power lines, in the aftermath of today's severe weather event. City crews are now in the process of assessing damage throughout Broken Arrow. Here is a brief summary of activities currently taking place:

- Broken Arrow Fire Department is monitoring areas where downed power lines have been reported.
- Broken Arrow Emergency Management Division is coordinating with PSO and other affected utilities to restore service.
- Streets Department employees are removing tree limbs from roadways.
- Additional emergency crews are out assessing damage.

The City has learned that around 65,000 PSO customers are currently without electricity in the metro area. PSO is stating it could take up to 24 - 48 hours for all power to be restored.

Broken Arrow Announces Residential Debris Pickup Plan

Greenwaste collection begins August 1

Broken Arrow, Okla. (7/15/2016) – Starting August 1, the City of Broken Arrow will provide free residential brush and tree limb debris pickup for residents affected by Thursday's storm. This applies to vegetative material only and excludes building materials and other construction debris. Streets and Stormwater Department crews will manage the pickup process, which will be completed in every Broken Arrow neighborhood within city limits.

Details and Instructions for Pick-up

- Residents must place brush and tree limb debris at their curb no later than July 31, 2016.
- Limbs must be cut in lengths of 8 feet or less.
- Do not cover water meters or place debris next to mail boxes.
- City crews will make one complete pass through the entire community.
- Pickup of greenwaste will take several weeks to complete and may be halted due to inclement weather or other critical responsibilities of the Streets and Stormwater Department.
- Cleanup of twigs and small branches will be the responsibility of the resident.

Other Options

- Residents who wish to dispose of their own storm debris may visit the following Tulsa area dropoff locations (fees will apply).
 - o Waste Management Quarry Landfill, 4041 N 141th E Ave, Tulsa
 - o City of Tulsa Greenwaste Site, 2100 N. 145th E. Ave (brush, limbs only)

- City of Broken Arrow utility customers may schedule a special pickup by calling the Action Center, 918-258-3587. The fee ranges from \$36 for a pickup of less than five cubic yards, to \$75 for six to 15 cubic yards. The fee will be added to the resident's utility bill.
- Vegetative debris may be set out with the normal, twice-weekly trash pickup; however, limbs and brush must be cut into four to five-foot lengths and tied into one-foot diameter bundles. Sanitation crews will take up to 10 trash bags and/or bundles per pickup during this period.
