# **External Marketing**

#### London Call Trip, July 7-8

Tulsa Regional Chamber and Broken Arrow Chamber of Commerce staff participated in scheduled appointments July 7-8. Meetings were held with two non-aerospace companies and two consultants in Leeds, London. Two potential projects were identified from the meetings. A follow-up appointment took place July 28 with one of the local companies looking to expand.

Farnborough International Airshow 2016 (July 10-13) and Lufthansa Technik - Hamburg (July 14): The 2016 Farnborough International Airshow is the world's largest aerospace exhibition. The Oklahoma delegation this year was led by Secretary of Commerce Deby Snodgrass; Secretary of Science and Technology, Dr. Steve McKeever and Tulsa Mayor Dewey Bartlett. Our exhibiting delegation consisted of representatives from the Tulsa Regional Chamber (Director Aerospace Development & Strategy; Senior VP for Economic Development); The Broken Arrow Chamber of Commerce and Economic Development Corporation; The Greater Oklahoma City Chamber; MidAmerica Industrial Park and five aerospace companies, four of which were from the Tulsa region. This year's keynote speakers were Senator James Inhofe and Meredith Siegfried, CEO, NORDAM. During the show, the Tulsa delegation met privately with more than 20 aerospace company executives. On July 14, the Tulsa delegation traveled to Hamburg, Germany to meet with senior executive at the Lufthansa Technik headquarters to thank them for the presence in Tulsa and discuss future growth opportunities for their two Tulsa business units (BizJet International and Lufthansa Technik Component Services) and tour their maintenance base.

Southern Economic Development Council "SEDC", Annual Conference July 31 – August 2, 2016
Tulsa Regional Chamber President and SVP of Economic Development attended the SEDC Annual
Conference July 31-August 2. This conference provides economic development professionals the
opportunity for individual contact with site selection consultants, and to learn about new trends in site

selection from the perspective of consultants who guide companies through their selection process for new locations. This conference helps strengthen relationships with the consultants and generate new leads for the Tulsa Region.

**Re:** Notes to Council – Updated 2017 Draft OneVoice Regional Tourism Task Force Issue Statements

OneVoice is Northeast Oklahoma's principle business-driven regional advocacy effort. Facilitated by the Tulsa Regional Chamber and 70 regional partner organizations, OneVoice engages the business community each year to identify key legislative priorities that advance the region and its business prosperity.

Each summer, nine OneVoice task forces meet to identify state and federal priorities in target areas. The top issues from each task force are then vetted by the OneVoice Summit in the fall, where the final OneVoice agenda is crafted.

Below are 2017 Draft OneVoice Issue Statements for the Regional Tourism Task Force

#### State


- 1. Self-Determination in Facility Firearm Policies: While acknowledging the rights granted by the Second Amendment, protect the current law giving venue owners, event operators, and recreational facilities the authority to control firearm policies on property they manage. Removing this control would endanger Oklahoma's ability to attract events that bring thousands of visitors and millions of dollars into our economy each year. Many events—especially in youth and collegiate sports—have non-negotiable firearm policies and removing the controls under current law would limit facility operators' ability to ensure the safety of their events, increase the cost of providing security, and could subject them to additional liability.
- **2. Public Arts Funding, Oklahoma Arts Council:** Maintain funding for public arts initiatives and arts-related programming, and an independent Oklahoma Arts Council in its current state. Both play a unique and vital role in sustaining Oklahoma's exceptional cultural resources, fostering creativity, and ensuring access to our heritage, offsetting the dearth of arts education in our schools, and attracting and retaining a talented workforce. Further, consolidation of the OAC would jeopardize more than \$1.5 million of federal and regional funding and programs for Oklahoma from the National Endowment for the Arts and the Mid-America Arts Alliance.
- **3. Route 66:** Promote Oklahoma's 400+ miles of Route 66 and its associated attractions and businesses as a cultural/heritage tourism destination. Route 66 is a tremendous economic engine that attracts hundreds of thousands of national and international tourists each year, and Oklahoma has the most miles of any of the eight states through which Route 66 passes. Tourism is the third largest industry in Oklahoma, and support for Route 66 will provide an enormous return on investment for our state. According to a report prepared for the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department, destination spending in Oklahoma totaled \$8.2 billion in 2014, creating \$366 million in public revenue for the state, \$261 million in revenue for municipalities, and supporting more than 95,000 jobs.
- **4. Airbnb:** While embracing innovation and entrepreneurship, support legislative efforts to ensure Airbnb and other short-term online rental companies operate legally in the state, subject to local regulation, and are held to standards comparable to the lodging industry, if operating as a business. Oklahoma should establish a framework for allowing hosts or hosting platforms to register at the state or local level, clarify in which cases a host is required to register, and regulate the collection of state/local taxes, where appropriate. Legislation must also reinforce the primacy of local laws on this issue.

**5. Oppose Consolidation of ORTD:** Oppose any effort to eliminate the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department through consolidation with the Department of Commerce. Eliminating or hindering ORTD through consolidation would have a negative impact on the state's attractiveness as a travel destination, and would also hurt our state-owned parks and resorts. Efforts by the Department of Tourism and Recreation

attracted 1.22 million new visitors to the state in the first half of 2015 alone. Travel spending is up 20% in Oklahoma, and we have seen a 15% increase in related state revenue produced. Efforts to consolidate the Department would hinder this progress, and would do more harm than good for state.

#### **Federal**

- 1. **Upgrade Air Transportation Infrastructure:** Accelerate improvements to our nation's air traffic control system, specifically targeting NextGen (air traffic control modernization) to boost air traffic capacities and efficiency. Flight delay cost travelers time and money, and result in lost business opportunities, cancelled meetings, and reduced optimization of airline resources. Today's ATC system is based on 1940's era radar and creates bottlenecks in severe weather and heavily congested airspace. NextGen utilizes a GPS through satellite-based navigation that provides sophisticated flight guidance technology, reducing flight delays and airline fuel consumption while increasing aircraft availability as a result of increased flight efficiency.
- 2. Page Belcher Federal Courthouse: Support the relocation of the Page Belcher Federal Courthouse tenants to repurpose the building as outlined in the City of Tulsa Downtown Master Plan, which is integral to the continued growth of downtown and will provide access to high-value mixed use residential, retail, and hotel development to support the adjacent BOK Center and Cox Business Center.
- 3. **Federal Historic Tax Credits:** Maintain federal Historic Rehabilitation Tax Credits for the restoration of historic buildings. These credits have for 30 years been an important catalyst for incentivizing private investment to preserve our nation's historically-significant buildings and revitalize the historic cores of American cities. The existing 20-percent income tax credit for certified historic structures and 10 percent credit for certain non-certified historic structures should be preserved.
- 4. **Aviation Workforce:** Support efforts by Congress to review federal flight training requirements and reduce the time and expense associated with reaching minimum commercial flight certification, while achieving comparable training levels. Despite record airline profits and low oil prices, the U.S. domestic airline network is getting smaller. New federal requirements for airline pilots implemented two years ago have created additional barriers for those seeking to enter this critical industry. This is affecting Tulsa and many other communities who have seen a loss of flights or no increase in service despite high passenger load factors. Congress should explore reforms in order to attract more pilots to this critical industry.
- 5. **Address Online Booking Scams:** Support legislation to prohibit a third party online reservation seller (an online seller that is not affiliated with the hotel or venue, nor provides services or accommodations) from charging a consumer unless the seller discloses all material terms of the transaction. Reforms to ensure transparency for consumers online are critical to addressing the growing problem of online booking scams, and will protect both consumers and businesses alike.

# Refuse and Recycling Survey Results Available on Website

BAMA will discuss at August 16 meeting

**Broken Arrow, Okla.** (8/9/16) – The City of Broken Arrow has received the results of the refuse and recycling survey that was conducted by telephone in May. Representatives from Gershman, Brickner & Bratton, Inc. will present the findings to the Broken Arrow Municipal Authority at the August 16 meeting.

"We look forward to discussing the results of this important survey with the City Council," said City Manager Michael Spurgeon. "We need to look to the future and determine how we can incorporate a curb-side recycling program into our operation."

The survey was conducted through SoonerPoll and asked residents about their satisfaction with the current trash system and gauged interest in a recycling program. The findings will help the City decide if and what changes should be made to the current waste disposal program.
