## Lane Closures After Labor Day at Aspen / Kenosha Intersection

Construction part of Aspen Avenue resurfacing project

**Broken Arrow, Okla.** (8/22/2016) – With the south leg of the Aspen Avenue resurfacing project completed, from just north of Washington Street to Houston Street, the City's contractor is now scheduled to begin work at the intersection of Aspen Avenue (145<sup>th</sup> East Avenue) and Kenosha Street (71<sup>st</sup> Street South). The intersection work is expected to take up to 45 days, weather permitting.

Starting September 6, only a single lane of traffic in all four directions will be allowed to travel through the intersection. Additionally, no left hand turns at the intersection will be permitted. Drivers will still have access to all businesses in the area. More than 50,000 cars travel through this intersection daily, making it one of the busiest intersections in Broken Arrow. **Drivers are encouraged to find an alternate route, if possible, as the single lane of traffic will cause delays.** The public's patience is appreciated while these necessary repairs are made.

Due to the distressed condition of the Aspen/Kenosha intersection, the contractor will remove portions of the existing roadway and patch the pavement down to the subgrade, before installing a new asphalt overlay. The mill and overlay project, which will ultimately improve a two-mile stretch of Aspen Avenue from Washington Street to Kenosha Street, began in mid-July and is expected to be completed in late December, weather permitting. The project costs \$1.6 million and will be paid for through 2011 General Obligation Bond and Sales Tax Capital Improvement funds.

## **Debris Pickup Completed**

**Broken Arrow, Okla.** (8/25/2016) – The Streets and Stormwater Department has completed residential and arterial pickup of greenwaste from the July 2016 storm.

## What to do with Remaining Greenwaste

City of Broken Arrow utility customers may schedule a special pickup by calling the Action Center, 918-258-3587. The fee ranges from \$36 for a pickup of less than five cubic yards, to \$75 for six to 15 cubic yards. The fee will be added to the resident's utility bill.

Additionally, vegetative debris may be set out with the normal, twice-weekly trash pickup; however, limbs and brush must be cut into four to five-foot lengths and tied into one-foot diameter bundles.

Residents who wish to dispose of their own storm debris may visit the following Tulsa area drop-off locations (fees will apply).

## **UPCOMING EVENTS**

Road will be closed from approximately 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. or when the last runner completes the course. Set up for Taste on Main begins at 7:00 am. And opens to the public at 11:00 am and ends at about 10:00 p.m. The Jolly Runner will include a 1K fun run and a 5K run. All proceeds from the Jolly Runner will be shared with The Multiple Sclerosis (MS) Foundation.
