### Media Event: New businesses planned for New Orleans Square

Developer announces new businesses at Cypress Place

On behalf of Red Dog Construction and Cypress Place Development, the City of Broken Arrow is pleased to announce three new businesses coming soon to New Orleans Square.

The developer is holding a press conference Tuesday, September 8, 2020 at 11:30 AM to celebrate the construction of the newly named Cypress Place retail center. The developer will announce the names of three tenants that have signed leases for the space. They include a family-friendly specialty restaurant with outdoor seating, a date night destination gift shop, and a local specialty healthcare provider.

Developer Josh McFarland said, "We are excited to announce the new businesses coming to this area, and we are working diligently to fill the remaining available space." Cypress Place was selected as the name of the retail center to play off the New Orleans theme recently chosen for the intersection.

"We are also having several conversations about a potential outparcel tenant," McFarland said.

The development, located on the east side of the Home Church building, is on the northwest corner of Elm Place & New Orleans Street in Broken Arrow. There is approximately 3,000 square feet of remaining available space currently being marketed.

### **Broken Arrow breaks ground on replacement Fire Station 7**

The new station will replace an aging station near New Orleans Square

Officials from the City of Broken Arrow will break ground on a replacement for Broken Arrow Fire Station 7 at 10:30 a.m., Monday, Sept. 14.

The ceremony will be held at the project site directly south of Arrowhead Park at 201 E. Washington St. (southeast corner of Washington (91<sup>st</sup>) Street and 1<sup>st</sup> Place). Parking for the event will be at the park; Broken Arrow Police will help pedestrians safely cross Washington.

The new station replaces an aging Station 7, currently located about one mile away on Elm Place north of New Orleans (101<sup>st</sup>) Street. This station had been decommissioned once before when the current Fire Station 2 was completed, but was put back into service when the Broken Arrow Fire Department expanded operations to include a seventh station in 2016. Among other deficiencies, it was built when firefighting apparatus were much smaller than they are today, meaning many of the department's modern fire engines will not fit in the old fire station.

"A great deal of data driven research was done to determine the most effective location for this and all future fire stations," said Fire Chief Jeremy Moore. "We are pleased to see this home for our firefighters come to fruition."

The new Fire Station 7 will have four bays sized and equipped for modern firefighting apparatus. Coweta-based Bravo Builders will construct the station, which will cost about \$3.6 million. The project is funded by the voter approved 2018 Build Our Future BA General Obligation Bond package.

# Broken Arrow to break ground on new Armed Forces Meeting Hall Facility will serve Military Veterans Groups in the City

Officials from the City of Broken Arrow will break ground Monday, Sept. 14, at 2:00pm on its new Armed Forces Meeting Hall.

The ceremony will be held at 1117 S. Main Street., the future site of the 4,600 square foot facility. The hall will feature home offices, meeting space, and a catering kitchen for the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the American Legion, Vietnam Veterans, the Military Order of the Purple Heart, and the Blue Star Mothers. The City is working with the representative veterans organizations that will use the facility on a building name and should have a decision in the next 30-45 days.

The City sought input from each of the representative organizations throughout the design process. Beginning in 2018, the City formed a building committee and each organization had one person designated to provide feedback on the hall's design. The five groups are subsequently forming a centralized non-profit organization and will enter into a use agreement with the City to occupy the facility at completion which is projected for August 2021.

Local contractor, Magnum Construction, will build the new facility at a cost of \$1,091,750 paid for by voter-approved 2018 General Obligation Bonds.



### Broken Arrow to Deliver New Single-Sort Recycling Carts, Collection to Begin in October

**BROKEN ARROW, Okla. (Sept. 9, 2020)** - The City of Broken Arrow is excited to announce recycling cart distribution will begin this month in preparation for the launch of its curbside recycling and trash cart program. More than 32,000 recycling carts will be delivered to homes this month. Collection service for trash and recycling is set to begin October 5<sup>th</sup>.

All Broken Arrow households will convert to a cart for trash service, and more than 90 % opted in to begin curbside recycling. The curbside recycling system allows for all Broken Arrowians to make more responsible choices with their household waste and collect more than 9 million pounds of new recyclables.

"The introduction of recycling to Broken Arrow's refuse program demonstrates the City's commitment to high quality and sustainable municipal programming," said City Manager Michael Spurgeon. "Our sanitation department has provided excellent customer service for years and we are excited to continue that high standard as we expand our services."

Residents are encouraged to practice their sorting now. The new recycling program will accept paper, plastic, metal, and glass in curbside recycling carts.

Some items that cannot be recycled include plastic bags, paper towels, electrical equipment (including cords), batteries, and clothing. These items often get placed into recycling carts because of "wishcycling," or the wish that they can be recycled. But well-intentioned, non-recyclable items cause serious issues in recycling facilities including equipment malfunction, unsafe work conditions, and the possibility of fires.

If residents initially opted out of recycling, and would like to add a recycling cart, they are able to do so by contacting the City after our initial transition period ends on Nov. 30. Following the beginning of service, the City will begin a recycling education campaign focusing on ensuring items placed in the blue recycling cart are able to be processed and made into new products.

Financial support for the more than 32,000 recycling carts and educational materials, as well as technical assistance for education efforts, is provided in part by The Recycling Partnership, a national nonprofit focused on transform recycling for good in states, cities and communities nationwide

"We are excited to see the City of Broken Arrow make it easier for residents to recycle by providing new, lidded, rolling recycling carts," said Chris Coady, Director of Community Programs at The Recycling Partnership. "We want to thank the American Beverage Association for helping fund this important initiative to increase recycling access and education that aids in supporting local jobs, saving taxpayers money, protecting the environment, and providing valuable feedstock for the manufacture of new products."





Who's Who of Broken Arrow's Past: PHENIE LOU OWNBY BROKEN ARROW'S FIRST AND ONLY WOMAN MAYOR

Phenie Lou Ownby made local news on April 10, 1931, when the Ledger's headline announced, "A Woman Mayor for Broken Arrow, City's Highest Office won By A Popular and Capable Lady." She had just won an election as the first woman mayor in Broken Arrow, as well as Oklahoma and nationally recognized as the sixth woman to hold the office of Mayor in the United States. Two years earlier, in 1929, Phenie was surprised to find her name on the local ballot. She was



popular among local citizens because she was honest and not shy about speaking her mind. Although she was not elected then, she ran a successful race two years later. Phenie Lou and her husband, Dr. Warren D. Ownby, Doctor of Osteopathy Medicine, were ahead of the times in the medical field of natural remedies when they moved to Broken Arrow prior to 1910 from Kirksville, Missouri. Phenie Lou assisted her husband in his practice, but was also a massage therapist in her own

right. She carried weekly ads in the Broken Arrow Ledger as a "Mechano-Therapist," Treating diseases by Massage and Swedish Movements." Their office was located in their home. Shortly after winning the election, Phenie Lou began a city-wide cleanup project. She and her eight-member council reviewed the consistent non-payment of water bills which was near bankruptcy of the municipal department. When the situation continued to be ignored in the next few months and the council did not have a solution, Phenie Lou decided to take matters in her own hands. She was not concerned about "political correctness" and did not mince her words, as she placed an ad in the Broken Arrow Ledger on February 19, 1932: You must pay your water bills at once or the water will be discontinued. Some that owe us can give big parties and have cars lined up in front of their home for half a block and can't or won't pay their water bill. You had better pay up or you won't be able to wash your dishes after the next party you give. I mean business. I like everybody and I am treating everybody alike. If you will read your home paper, you will find so and so visited in Oklahoma City and elsewhere; still they do not have money for the good Broken Arrow water. Some people seem to think the world owes them something. Maybe it does, but you won't get it from this administration."

This lady rocked the Office of Mayor in Broken Arrow 88 years ago, only 12 years after the 19th Amendment became a law allowing the Right for Women to Vote. Let's celebrate Phenie Lou and the 100th anniversary of this historic and important amendment. She is still the only woman to hold the office of Mayor in the City of Broken Arrow.
