Snow and Ice Control

The Streets and Stormwater Department responded to the winter weather event that occurred on December 13 & 14 2020. At approximately 5:00 a.m., on Sunday December 13, 2020, the Streets and Stormwater Department dispersed a crew of nine individuals, utilizing 118 personnel hours and 36 tons of salt. Eight trucks were utilized to pre-treat and plow bridges/overpasses and arterial streets. Approximately 10 hours into the snow shift two plows broke down. Crews did hook up 2 other plows, but they were not utilized until the evening shift.

At approximately 8:00p.m., on Sunday December 13, 2020 the Streets and Stormwater Department dispersed a crew of ten individuals, utilizing 120 personnel hours and used 180 tons of salt. Eight trucks were utilized to plow the remaining snow off of the streets and to pre-treat streets and bridges.

At approximately 7:00 a.m., on Monday December 14, 2020 the Streets and Stormwater Department dispersed a crew of ten individuals, utilizing 81 personnel hours and used 18 tons of salt. Seven trucks were utilized to plow center lanes and salt slick spots.

At approximately 8:00 p.m., on Monday December 14, 2020 the Streets and Stormwater Department dispersed a crew of twelve individuals, utilizing 125 personnel hours and used 99 tons of salt. Seven trucks were used to treat slick spots during the winter weather event.

The Streets and Stormwater Department responded to the winter weather event that occurred on December 15, 2020. At approximately 8:30 p.m., on Tuesday December 15, 2020 the Streets and Stormwater Department dispersed a crew of five individuals, utilizing 52.5 personnel hours and used 3.5 tons of salt. Five trucks were used to treat slick spots and to plow Windrow off Washington, between Olive and Garnett on the South side. Crews also emptied all sanders and monitored the radio during the winter weather event.
