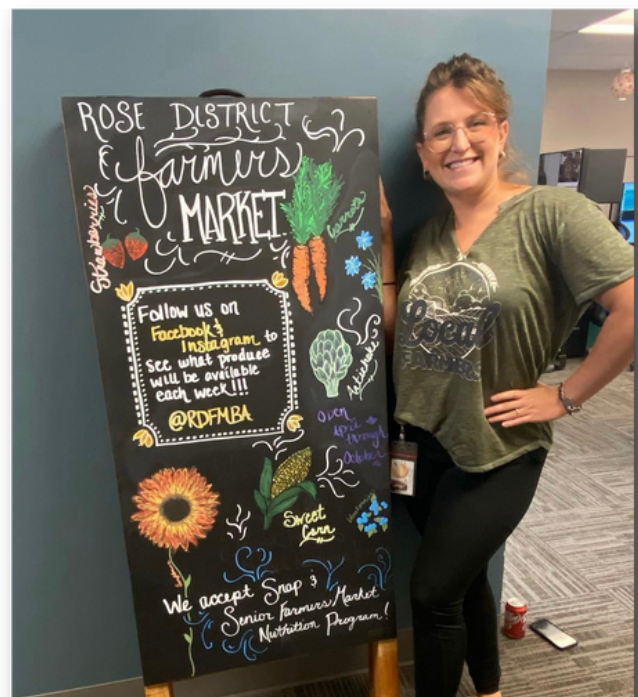

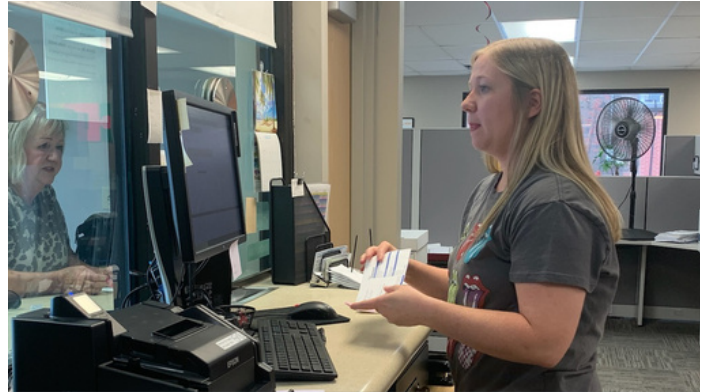

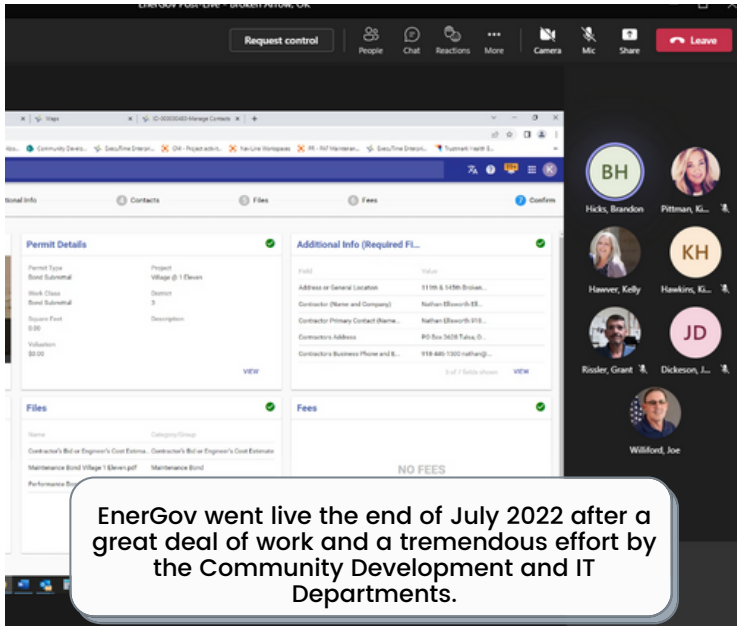

Key Projects

Improving Police Video storage – The IT team presented a preliminary demonstration of a better way of securing all Police related videos and will be establishing a full meeting with PD to demonstrate the process and the needed workflow changes to strengthen security.

BA Museum Historical Mapping – The GIS Division is working on providing a webmap and printed version of the Hastains Creek National Allotment Map. This project has been a joint effort with the BA Museum with consultation with the Muscogee Nation, NSU – Tahlequah professors, and PHD students from the University of California Davis.

Granicus Host Compliance – Community Development is on track to go live with Granicus' Host Compliance system in August. During July, the department focused on completing the necessary User Acceptance Testing for the Hotline and the Citizen Portal.

Network Equipment Refresh – The IT team began the planning and design to upgrade the City of Broken Arrow network infrastructure. This will further improve Cybersecurity as well as replace aging network appliances.

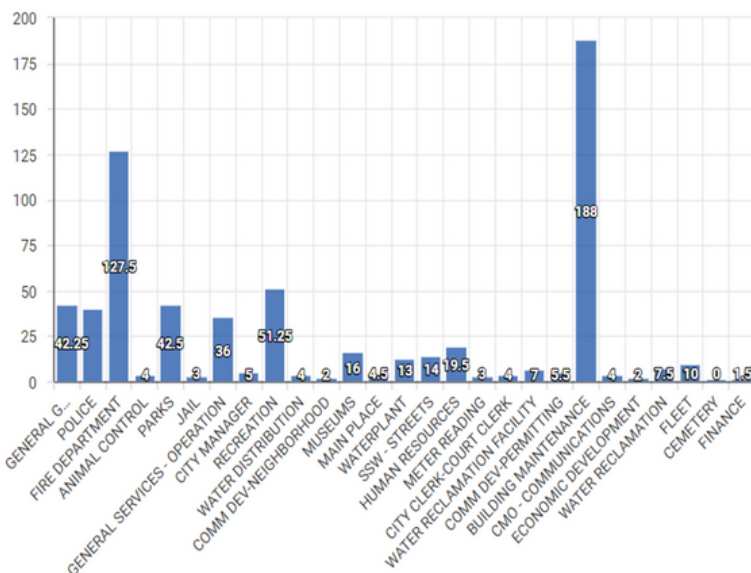

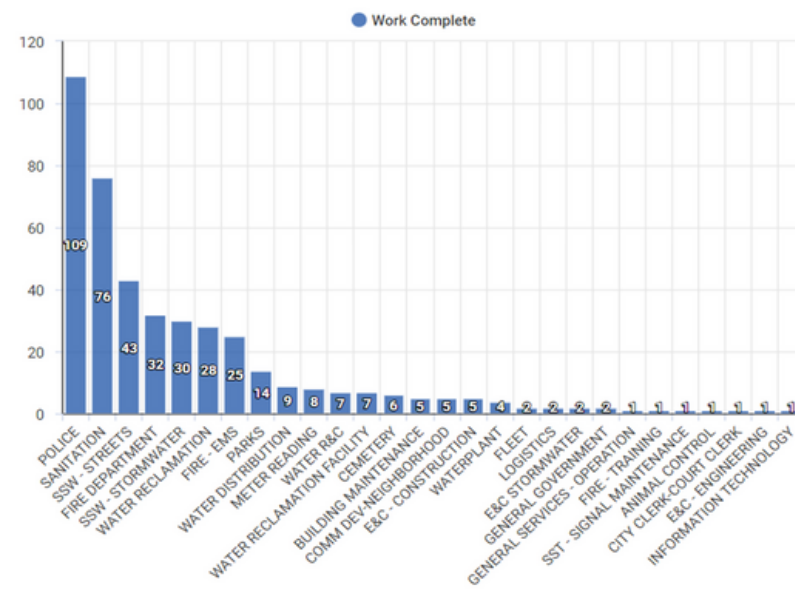

This project consisted of overlaying the existing asphalt roadway surface with an additional 2" of new hot mix asphalt roadway surface. The budget amount for this project is \$36,400. The new asphalt surface work was performed by the Streets and Stormwater Department. This project is complete.



Project ST23120-East Houston Street Resurfacing

This project consisted of milling or removing 2" of existing asphalt roadway surface and paving 2" of new hot mix asphalt roadway surface. The budget amount for this project is \$109,200. The asphalt milling work was performed by A&A Construction and the new asphalt surface work was performed by the Streets and Stormwater Department. The completed work is from Lynn Lane to East Fort Worth Street. The remaining work for this project consists of adding curb and gutter and resurfacing work from East Fort Worth Street to East Dallas Street.

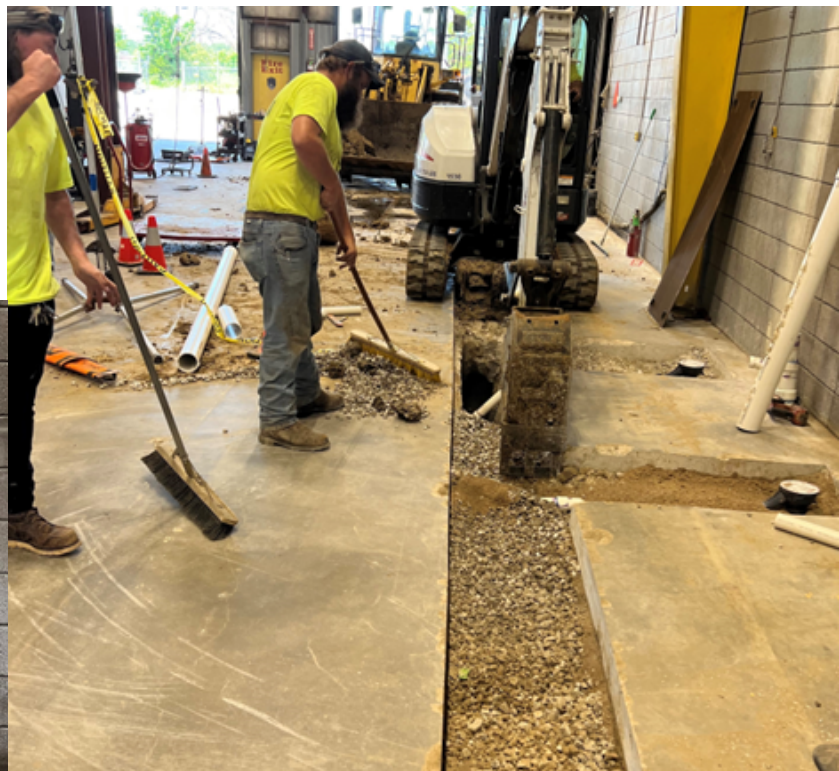

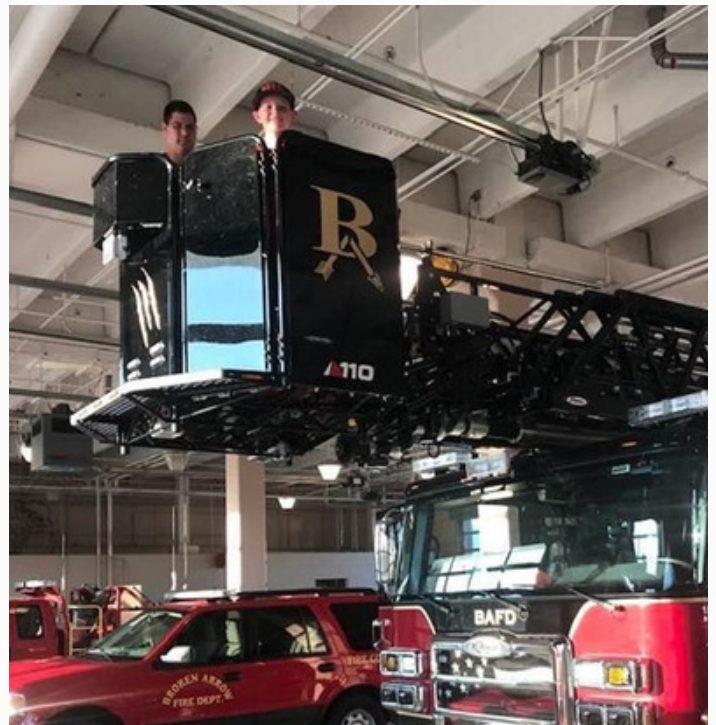
