Curbside Refuse Pickup	\$21.75
Extra refuse outside of cart	\$5.00/bag
Large refuse bags (larger than 30 gallons)	Count as 2 bags
Yard waste in excess of 20 clear bags	\$5.00/bag
Late set-out/return service fee	\$10.50
Bulky pick-up	\$20/cubic yard
Refuse cart size change fee	1st one free, then \$20
Cart add/remove fee	1st one free, then \$20
Cart replacement	\$55
Additional refuse cart/month (96 gallon only)	\$7.50
Additional recycling cart	\$7.50

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- Your refuse and recycling carts must be set on the street, wheels touching the curb by 6 a.m. on your service day.
- We can only service carts assigned to your residence. No personal cans, carts, or bins.
- If your cart is not out at the time our crew comes by to service it, you
 have the option to request a **return service** by calling
 918-259-6570.
- Large item (**bulky**) pickups including but not limited to: Mattresses, furniture items, major appliances, carpet, and yard equipment can be scheduled by calling 918-259-6570.
- The M.e.t. operates a recycling and e-waste center at 302 N. Elm Pl in Broken Arrow. Electronic items and some other recyclables not accepted in our curbside program can be recycled there.
- If you observe a deceased animal on the side of the road, please call 918-259-6570 with the location.
- Collection days that fall on a holiday are made up using a "slide" method (Monday's pickups will be on Tuesday; Tuesday's pickups will be on Wednesday; and so on).







IMPORTANT REMINDERS

Follow these guidelines for the most efficient curbside program!



OI CARTS OUT BY 6AM

On the street, wheels touching the curb, 3 feet of space between each cart, and 8 feet away from all obstructions.



ONLY CITY-ISSUED CARTS

We can only service carts assigned to your residence. No personal cans, carts, or bins.




03 RETURN SERVICE

We now offer a return service. If your cart is not out at the time our crew comes by to service it, you now have the option to request a return service. The fee is \$10.50 and will be added to your next water bill.



What does the Solid Waste & Recycling Crew pick up?



All non-recyclable items should be placed in the black trash carts.



Never dispose of the following in either cart: oil, wet paint, exposed needles, soil, rocks, batteries, solvents, acids, hot ashes, medical waste, sand.







CART SPACING

Where to put your trash and recycling carts

- Leave space for a mail vehicle to access the mailbox.
- If possible, place your carts on the opposite side of your driveway from the mailbox.
- Carts should be placed at least 8 feet from any obstruction including vehicles, basketball hoops, light poles, and mailboxes.
- Carts should be placed in the street with wheels against the curb.

Carts are 3 feet apart from each other and 8 feet apart from obstructions













Bulky Item Pickups

Large item pickups include but are not limited to:
Mattresses and/or box spring sets, hot water heaters,
disassembled swing sets, furniture items, major
appliances, carpet, and yard equipment.

Major appliances with refrigeration systems will be accepted only if the proper documentation is attached which confirms the refrigerant has been properly removed by a licensed CFC technician.








Disposal of Electronics (E-waste)

The Metropolitan Environmental Trust (M.e.t.) operates a recycling and e-waste center at 302 N. Elm Place in Broken Arrow. The following electronic items can be recycled there for *free*: Cameras, computer batteries and towers, copiers/scanners/printers, fax machines, keyboards/mouse, laptops, microwaves, phones, power cords, small appliances, VCR/DVD players. These items have a *small fee* associated: TVs and CRT monitors.



Deceased Animals

If you observe a dead animal on the side of the road, please call the Solid Waste and Recycling Department at (918) 259-6570 and provide the location. If you need to dispose of a deceased pet, please call to arrange a pickup. You will need to place the animal in a trash bag and place the bag on the curb for service.

Disposal is Free for Tulsa Residents

Disposing of Household Pollutants

The City of Tulsa's Household Pollutant Collection Facility (HPCF) is open year-round and is free for Tulsa residents to dispose of household pollutants.

The household pollutant facility is the first of its kind in northeast Oklahoma. Certified staff with more than 25 years of experience and training is on site to handle household pollutant materials. The facility only accepts household pollutants generated by household users and the facility is not available for commercial companies or businesses. The HPCF services the greater Tulsa metro area. Residents who live outside of the City of Tulsa limits can dispose of up to 45 pounds of pollutants for free with vouchers from the M.e.t. Non-Tulsa residents should contact the M.e.t. at (918) 584-0584 for more information on disposal of pollutants at the HPCF.

The Importance of Proper Disposal

Did you know many of the chemicals we have in our households could be considered hazardous if used or disposed of in an improper way? The City hopes a permanent disposal facility will discourage disposal of household pollutants down sanitary sewers, storm drains, or into the trash and recycling systems, which pose a risk for the environment, water sources, wastewater collection and treatment systems, and for staff handling the household pollutant materials in the trash and recycling systems.

Accepted and Non-Accepted Items

All wastes are subject to inspection and possible rejection. If wastes are not accepted by the facility it is the customers' responsibility to dispose of the waste properly and within federal, state and local laws.

Accepted Items Include:

- ✓ Fluorescent and CFL Lightbulbs
- Oil Based Paints, Latex Paints and Paint Thinner
- ✓ Flammable Liquids
- Lawn Chemicals
- Automotive Fluids
- ✓ Cooking Oil/Grease

- Aerosols
- Household and Car Batteries
- Household Cleaners
- Pool Chemicals
- Small Electronics (no televisions)
- ✓ Thermostats*

Non-Accepted Items Include:

- Industrial or Commercially Generated Waste (including NHIW waste)
- ★ Medical or Biomedical Waste**
- × Asbestos
- Food or Organic Waste

- × Radioactive Material
- ★ Ammunition/Explosives
- **X** Tires
- Unknown Materials or Substances

Swap Shop

The City of Tulsa also offers a "swap shop" where citizens can shop free of charge from new or lightly used products collected at the HPCF. No drop-off of chemicals required to participate. Customers are allowed to take up to five items and will be required to sign a waiver to take items from the Swap Shop.
