Definitions


- **Priority 1 =** Crimes in progress involving life threatening circumstances and situations that produce or are likely to produce serious bodily injury or death to any person.
- Priority 2 = Crimes in progress or that have just occurred, incidents in progress that present the potential for injury or property damage/loss, situations where the suspect is still at the scene or in the area and will elude apprehension or create the potential for injury or property damage if the police do not arrive rapidly, incidents where an officer is needed to secure a scene or witnesses, and incidents where there is a need for crowd control or traffic control which, if not done immediately, would create the imminent potential for injury or property damage/loss.
- **Priority 3 =** Crimes against people that are misdemeanors in progress or that have just occurred, reports of recent felony crimes, suspicious circumstances with no threat of injury, and incidents that do not require an officer immediately, but need investigation, mediation, or intervention.
- Priority 4 = Property or service related calls for an officer to respond that cannot be handled by telephone, misdemeanor reports when caller demands officer or when an officer needs to investigate the scene or interview witnesses, and requests for officers that do not require a quick response.

Detours Around Two Downtown Road Closures Start Wednesday, Jan. 18 Businesses will remain accessible

Broken Arrow, Okla. (1/13/17) – Improvements on two downtown Broken Arrow roads will require street closures in order for City contractors to complete the work.

MAIN STREET

Beginning Wednesday, January 18, Main Street between Dallas Street and Ft. Worth Street will be closed so that five (5) street crossings can be constructed for pedestrians. Detour signs will be in place that shift traffic to Ash Avenue and 1st Street. The work is expected to be completed in approximately one week.

DALLAS STREET

Beginning Wednesday, January 18, Dallas Street will be closed from Elm Place to Cedar Avenue for approximately 60 days to improve the roadway within the railroad right-of-way. The work will include a new concrete pavement roadway section, waterline work, storm sewer system work and a new pedestrian sidewalk and railroad crossing advanced warning system. Detour signs will be in place. We appreciate the public's patience while this necessary road work is completed.

BUSINESS ACCESS

All businesses in the area will remain open. Main Street Square (Fleet Feet, Hops & Hangers, Painted Lyon, Primitive, Simplicity) customers may access the stores by using the Dallas Street entrance on the east side of Main Street.

Liberty Parkway Trail Under Construction for Repairs

Broken Arrow, Okla. (1/5/17) – The Liberty Parkway Trail between Elm Place and 9th Street (Lynn Lane) will be closed starting January 6, 2017 for repair work on the retaining wall and drainage pipe near that section of the trail. Liberty Parkway Trail is a bicycling and walking trail next to the Creek Turnpike. A section of the trail has been closed since December 2015 due to weather-related damage. Construction on the repairs is expected to finish in mid-March, weather permitting.

In the meantime, trail users may still use the Elm Place trail head but will have to head west toward Aspen Avenue. A trail head is also located at the Northeastern State University (NSU) Broken Arrow campus.

Cherokee Pride Construction, Inc. has been contracted to make the repairs, and the City's Engineering and Construction department will manage the project. The repairs will cost approximately \$186,000 and will be paid for through Sales Tax Capital Improvement funds.

"We look forward to the Liberty Trail being repaired so that this trail segment can be reopened to the public by spring," said Parks and Recreation Director Scott Esmond.

4-Way Stop at Aspen / Detroit Intersection Starts Jan. 17

Traffic signal upgrade could take up to a week

Broken Arrow, Okla. (1/9/2017) – Starting Tuesday, January 17, drivers will encounter a fourway stop at the intersection of Aspen Avenue and Detroit Street due to traffic signal upgrades. The work is expected to take up to four (4) days to complete.

Upgrades include a new signal cabinet, push buttons for the new handicap accessible ramps and video detection to replace the in-pavement loops.

The public's patience is appreciated while these necessary improvements are made. Drivers should expect mild delays during rush hour traffic. If possible, drivers are encouraged to find an alternate route until the work is completed.


FARMER'S MARKET Mark your Calendars! Opening Day for the Rose District Farmers Market is April 1st. We are very excited about moving back to our original location at the Rose District Pavilion. At the end of last year's market, we asked the vendors what we could improve upon for the 2017 market. Overwhelmingly, the response was a two day market week. We also asked some of the patrons of the market and they also responded the same with evening hours during the week. So this year, the market will take place Tuesday evenings from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 7:00 a.m. to 12 noon. We are very excited about the change and hope that it brings more people downtown to visit the Rose District both a week day evening and early on Saturday mornings. Again the market will open April 1st and run through the last weekend in October. A complete schedule of special events at the market and entertainment will be forthcoming.

SPECIAL EVENTS COMMITTEE (SEC) The SEC is in process of reviewing the past year's events and looking at what we could improve upon for the 2017 event season. Some items that we will be working on include updates to the Resource Guide, adding an appendix to the Resource Guide for Public Safety, and updating the application to be more user-friendly. We have completed the application updates and have published them to the website. The proposed updates to the Resource Guide will be discussed in the Special Event Committee meetings in February. We are anticipating a completion date of March 31st. More information regarding those updates will be forthcoming.


SPECIAL EVENTS The Shamrock event which usually takes place in March has been cancelled for this year.

At the end of each year, we review the previous year's special events activities to see what has transpired over the previous year. As we looked back and reviewed the data, we found the following:

Calendar year 2016: We received 130 applications of which 8 events were cancelled leaving a total of 122 events which was a 47% increase over last year (2015), 93% increase from 2 years ago (2014) and 408% increase over three years ago (2013).




Fiscal year 2015-2016: We received 112 applications which was a 65% increase over last year (2014-15) and 143% increase over 2 years ago (2013-14) and 387% increase over three years ago (2012-13).





Projected Fiscal Year (conservative estimate): Based on 130 applications: 16% increase over 2015-16. 91% increase over 2014-15. 182% increase over 2013-14 and 465 % increase over 2012-13. See above graphic.


Concentration: May, June, and July (12 events in 20 days each), August (10 events in 14 days), Sept (15 events in 20 days), and November (14 events in 18 days).
