Red Flag 2016

Red Flag Annual Report to City Council- The city established an Identity Theft Program in April of 2009 in compliance with Federal Trade Commission directives. This law has been enforced since December 31, 2010. The Red Flag Committee convened this month and reviewed activity for the past year. We have adopted a new policy for the utilities department regarding the opening of utility accounts. To better protect the City and its customers from Identity Theft we will now require a signed contract along with some form of physical ID be shown before we open an account and turn on service. We will accept a copy of a state ID through email or fax or a citizen can have a physical inspection of their ID at the counter to verify their identity. We decided on this policy after extensive research of neighboring cities with similar populations. We found that cities like Coweta and Stillwater require all citizens to come in in person to present their ID and open their accounts. Whereas Tulsa and Norman don't require an ID only a social security number to open their accounts. We decided to model our new policy after the city of Edmonds current policy which requires ID to be shown, although it allows the flexibility of scanning in their ID instead of an in-person interaction. We will implement this policy effective April 1st, 2017. Training has been completed through SGR for all relevant employees. We currently have no knowledge of attempts at identity theft for this year and our Identity Theft Prevention Program is operational.

Upcoming Road Projects in Broken Arrow to Impact Traffic

Broken Arrow, Okla. (3/17/2017) – The City of Broken Arrow is advising drivers about two upcoming road projects that will impact traffic.

JASPER STREET

Jasper Street (131st Street) from Aspen to Elm (145th E. Ave. to 161st E. Ave.) will be resurfaced beginning Monday, March 20. The Jasper Street resurfacing project costs \$70,000 and is being paid for through 2014 General Obligation Bond funds.

March 20 and 21 will involve road preparation; at this time traffic will be stop and go. On March 22 crews will repave the westbound lanes, and only westbound traffic will be allowed through the construction area. On March 23, crews will move to the eastbound lanes and only eastbound traffic will be allowed through. Detour signs will be placed to direct drivers around the construction.

DOWNTOWN STREETSCAPES

The final phase of Streetscapes IV is planned to begin April 3. Main Street will be closed from Elgin Street to College Street for approximately two weeks. Construction crews will install wider sidewalks and rose beds to match the rest of the Rose District aesthetic.

Streetscapes IV is a continuation of Rose District improvements that began in 2010. This phase (which includes the recently completed improvements on Main Street from Dallas to Ft. Worth) costs \$1.3 million and is being paid for through 2014 General Obligation bonds and Vison 2025 surplus funds.





ARTS ACTION ALERT

Take Action Now!

At 7am on March 16th, the new Trump Administration released their <u>budget proposal</u> to fund the federal government for the coming fiscal year (FY2018). The Trump proposal includes massive budget cuts (more than \$54 billion in cuts to domestic programs in one year alone). **The proposal includes the proposed elimination of the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA)**, the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH), the Institue of Museum and Library Services (IMLS), and the Corporation for National and Community Services (Americorps), among other federal agencies.

What Does This Mean?

As previous reported, advisors to the President were recommending this elimination, and conservative groups like the Heritage

Foundation have been attempting to end the NEA for decades, not to mention calls for its termination in budget resolutions passed by the U.S. House of Representatives in years' prior.

Is There Any Good News?

This proposal is a blueprint and will be considered by Congress, but like all proposals, Congress will be considering their own budget priorities-and likely without much regard to the administration's request.

In fact, President Trump himself encouraged Congress to make some funding decisions independent of the executive branch. He stated as much last year in response to questions about arts funding. He said, "The Congress, as representatives of the people, make the determination as to what the spending priorities ought to be." And, members of Congress are already speaking out against the Trump budget, including some Republicans, who are calling the proposal "dead on arrival."

But make no mistake, we are taking the Trump proposal seriously and are calling on you now to contact your representatives in Congress. Let them know that **eliminating the NEA would be a devastating blow to the arts in America.** For more than 50 years, the NEA has expanded access to the arts for all Americans, awarding grants in every Congressional district throughout all 50 states and U.S. Territories as well as placing arts therapists in 12 military hospitals to help returning soldiers heal from traumatic brain injuries. The NEA is also an economic powerhouse, generating more than \$600 million annually in additional matching funds and helping to shape a \$730 billion arts and culture industry that represents 4.2% of the nation's GDP and supports 4.8 million jobs.
