Definitions

- Priority 1 =** Crimes in progress involving life threatening circumstances and situations that produce or are likely to produce serious bodily injury or death to any person.
- Priority 2 =** Crimes in progress or that have just occurred, incidents in progress that present the potential for injury or property damage/loss, situations where the suspect is still at the scene or in the area and will elude apprehension or create the potential for injury or property damage if the police do not arrive rapidly, incidents where an officer is needed to secure a scene or witnesses, and incidents where there is a need for crowd control or traffic control which, if not done immediately, would create the imminent potential for injury or property damage/loss.
- Priority 3 =** Crimes against people that are misdemeanors in progress or that have just occurred, reports of recent felony crimes, suspicious circumstances with no threat of injury, and incidents that do not require an officer immediately, but need investigation, mediation, or intervention.
- Priority 4 =** Property or service related calls for an officer to respond that cannot be handled by telephone, misdemeanor reports when caller demands officer or when an officer needs to investigate the scene or interview witnesses, and requests for officers that do not require a quick response.

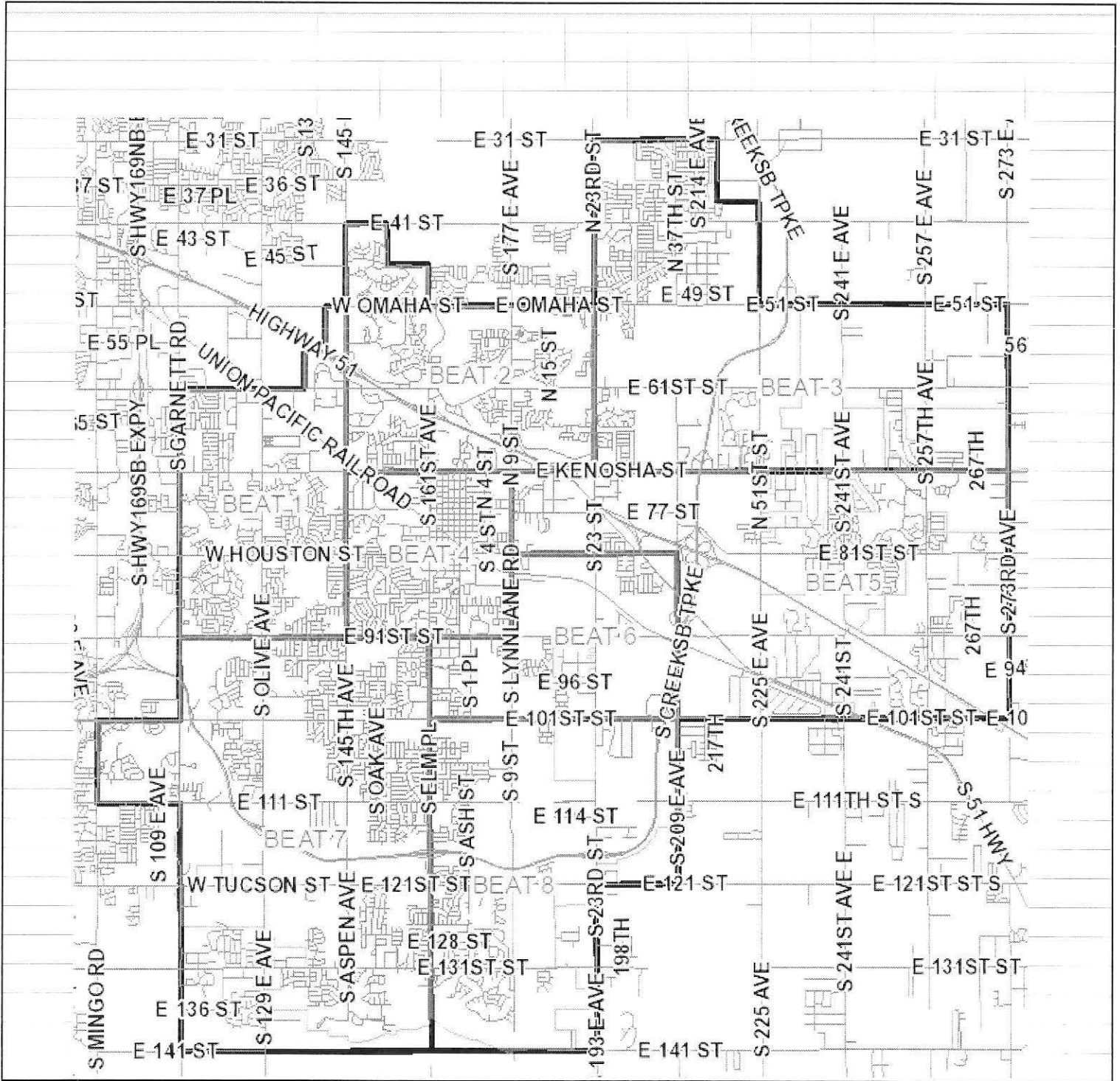

Sieling Park Closed Due to Sanitary Sewer Leak

Broken Arrow, Okla. (5/9/17) – The City of Broken Arrow has temporarily closed Sieling Park, located at 525 W. Iola Street, due to environmental concerns caused by a sanitary sewer leak. There are no known hazards, but the City is taking extra precautions to ensure the public’s safety.

City crews are currently investigating the cause of the leak, which occurred at a construction site near the Broken Arrow Expressway and Elm Place.

Following routine procedure, Utilities Department staff have notified the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality (ODEQ).

NEW UPDATE: Sieling Park Now Open - E. Coli Levels Down
5:00 p.m., 5-11-17

Broken Arrow, Okla. (5/11/17) – The most recent testing shows that the amount of E. coli in the creek at Sieling Park has dropped to acceptable levels. This means we will now reopen Sieling Park to the public. It should be noted that the sample tested was taken from the creek yesterday before the recent rains.

Sieling Park, 525 W. Iola Street in Broken Arrow, had been closed since Tuesday, after a sewer overflow was discovered near the BA Expressway and Elm Place. A contractor working at a private construction site damaged a sewer line last week, which resulted in a sewer bypass that impacted a nearby creek. Sewage flowed downstream to a detention pond and into Sieling Park. The contractor has agreed to pay for repairs to the sewer line.


