Mr. Spurgeon-

The following projects will have roadway closure impacts for the traveling public that we wanted to inform you and council of.

Rose District Mill and Overlay

The project has been issued a notice to proceed for October 11th and consists of rehab of multiple streets within the Rose District. With execution of this contract complete road closures will be required due to extensiveness of the pavement patches and confined work zones. We have divided the work into 4 phases; Ph. 1 – Commercial St, Ph. 2 – Dallas St., Ph. 3 – Ft. Worth, and Ph. 4 – El Paso. Phase 1 is scheduled to start Oct. 11th, and tentatively Phase 2 on Oct. 19th, Phase 3 on Oct. 30th, and Phase 4 on Nov. 9th with completion of the project by November 23rd. Detours and local traffic allowances will take place during each of the phases.

We will be coordinating with the Chamber of Commerce, BA Schools, and local business's

4-Ton Bridge Rehabilitation

This project consists of installing new bridge beams under the existing bridge due to loading issues. In order to perform this work, County Line Road between Houston and Washington will have to be closed during the placement of the beams for the safety of the traveling public. The road closure is scheduled for Sunday, October 15, 2017 from 1pm to 5pm, in order to minimize impact on an arterial roadway. Detours will be in place during this period of time.



Mr. Robins,

We have reviewed the scope to the subject project and believe we can install the new beams without first removing the old beams. Considering this, we also believe the work can be performed during normal business hours except for the final beam jacking. We will do the final jacking with no live load on the bridge deck. This will require closing the road for a maximum of 4 hours. We propose to do this on Sunday. We propose to install traffic control as follows:

- Type 2 signs at County Line and Washington and County Line and New Orleans "Road Work Ahead"
- Type 2 signs 500 feet each side of the bridge "Road Work Ahead"
- During jacking, Type 3 Road Closed to through traffic at 101st and 91st and road closed on both sides of the
- "Road Closed" Type 1 signs at 94th, 96th, and 97th

Broken Arrow breaks ground on City's first dog park

Broken Arrow, Okla. (10/6/17) – The City of Broken Arrow will break ground on the Rose West Dog Park, the City's first dog park, at 10:00 a.m., Tuesday, Oct. 10. Leashed dogs and their owners are welcome to attend the groundbreaking.

The park will feature two separate, fenced play areas, one for large and one for small dogs; a transition area so dogs' reactions can be judged before letting them into the play areas; a restroom facility and water fountains for both humans and canines. Shade structures will be added in the future.

The restrooms and water fountains will also be open to cyclists and joggers using the adjoining Liberty Park Trail.

Funded by the 2014 General Obligation Bond, construction of the park will cost \$473,000. The five acres of land for the park was donated by Joan and Monte Dunham in October 2011 with the request that the park be named after Rose West, the former owner of the property who enjoyed the wildflowers that grow there.

The park is expected to be completed in the spring of 2018.
