PARADE ROAD CLOSURE



Mayor Grace Robinson faced all the slings and arrows associated with running the Broken Arrow City Council on May 2. The only difference in this meeting that it was the Youth City Council's mock meeting.

It may not have counted, but Robinson and the rest of the "council members" ran a meeting like their official counterparts. They faced tough decisions on zoning and listened to pleas from a new church pastor, a chamber representative and a land owner with a broken knee.

"It's been a ride," said Robinson after the mock meeting.

How did Mayor Robinson prepare?

"I watched online and tried to keep it as much to the real thing," said Robison, who will attend the Air Force Academy next fall.

The YCC also presented its "Big Idea" to hold citizen meetings on a regular basis so the regular council could stay close to the people they serve.

The public forums will be held in April and October. The regular council approved the idea.
