Broken Arrow Crews Continue to Treat Icy Roads

Broken Arrow, Okla. (02/16/2015) – City of Broken Arrow street crews will apply another round of salt and sand today, in an effort to melt the ice that has accumulated on City streets.

From 7:30 p.m. Sunday to 7:30 a.m. today, crews have applied 315 tons of sand and 90 tons of salt.

Workers have successfully cleared snow from many arterial streets and will continue plowing operations until the snow is removed.

As the layer of ice that formed underneath the snow melts, crews will go back and plow away the slush.

Crews will continue to work 12 hour shifts around the clock as needed.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: SNOW REMOVAL POLICY

The City of Broken Arrow is tasked with maintaining more than 439 lane miles for snow routes. A summary of the City's snow removal policy is provided below. A brochure that includes more information, along with a map of arterial and secondary streets, can be found at www.BrokenArrowOK.gov.

- During snow events, Streets Department crews will clear arterial roadways first as conditions warrant, with consideration for side streets (also known as collector/feeder roads) discussed after arterials are cleared.
- Neighborhood streets will not be plowed, unless the grade of street(s) exceeds a 10% slope.
- If freezing rain is forecasted, crews will pretreat the roadways with a mixture of sand and salt.
- The City has 12 dump trucks equipped with snow plows and sanders. The Streets Department operates on two 12-hour shifts during snow operations, 24 hours each day during inclement weather.

Broken Arrow Roads Update, Day 3

Broken Arrow, Okla. (02/17/2015) – Broken Arrow street crews will continue to monitor slick areas around the City, including neighborhood roads with a grade of 10 percent or greater. It is anticipated that warmer temperatures will help melt the remaining ice on residential streets.

Crews on Monday successfully cleared most of the ice and slush from arterial roads. Drivers should remain attentive for patches of black ice.

From 7:30 p.m. Sunday to 7:30 a.m. today, crews have applied 637 tons of sand and 182 tons of salt.
