

Definitions


- Priority 1 =** Crimes in progress involving life threatening circumstances and situations that produce or are likely to produce serious bodily injury or death to any person.
- Priority 2 =** Crimes in progress or that have just occurred, incidents in progress that present the potential for injury or property damage/loss, situations where the suspect is still at the scene or in the area and will elude apprehension or create the potential for injury or property damage if the police do not arrive rapidly, incidents where an officer is needed to secure a scene or witnesses, and incidents where there is a need for crowd control or traffic control which, if not done immediately, would create the imminent potential for injury or property damage/loss.
- Priority 3 =** Crimes against people that are misdemeanors in progress or that have just occurred, reports of recent felony crimes, suspicious circumstances with no threat of injury, and incidents that do not require an officer immediately, but need investigation, mediation, or intervention.
- Priority 4 =** Property or service related calls for an officer to respond that cannot be handled by telephone, misdemeanor reports when caller demands officer or when an officer needs to investigate the scene or interview witnesses, and requests for officers that do not require a quick response.
- Priority 5 =** Primarily Officer initiated calls or ten codes used for in-house purposes.

Broken Arrow, Okla. (2/6/2014) – Broken Arrow will have one race in the April 7 City Council Election, after the Tulsa County Election Board released the results of the February 2 – 4 filing period.

Ward 4 Council Member Jill Norman has filed for re-election. Scott Eudey has also filed for the Ward 4 Council seat and will run against Norman in the nonpartisan election.

Ward 3 Council Member Mike Lester and At Large Council Member Johnnie Parks have been elected without opposition. Both will serve another four-year term.

The April 7 Broken Arrow City Council Election is open to all registered voters living within the Broken Arrow city limits.

The Broken Arrow Police Department recommends all users of peer to peer sales sights (such as Craig's List) conduct all face to face transactions in a well-lit, high traffic, public place.

BAPD is allowing the public parking lot and lobby area of the Public Safety Complex, located at 1101 N. Sixth Street, to be used for these transactions in order to minimize safety concerns.

The Public Safety Complex is well lit, has video surveillance, and has officers coming and going throughout the day.

This is no guarantee that you will not be deceived in your transaction but the police department hopes it will help to deter fraudulent activity while providing a relatively safe place to meet. The police department will not, however, settle disputes that may occur because of a transaction(s).
