Re: Elm and Broken Arrow Expressway traffic signal damage-update

The traffic signal at the Elm and Broken Arrow Expressway was knocked down Thursday evening, resulting in a signal outage over the expressway. Broken Arrow signal maintenance crews set up four-way stop signs as temporary traffic control. This morning crews returned to repair the damaged wiring, restore power and achieve a four-way flash at the remaining signals. Meanwhile, the Division Manager contacted Traffic Lighting Systems for assistance in locating a replacement pole and assistance in replacing the pole. Fortunately, the company was available to assist us and had a used pole of similar proportions with the correct mounting base to replace our damaged pole. Work progressed quickly and without complications. By 2:30 pm the contractor, along with our signal crew, restored the intersection to full operation.

Broken Arrow is fortunate to have located a used replacement pole so quickly, speeding up the repair process from multiple days to one. Having to order a new pole, typically taking 8-10 weeks to arrive, would delay permanent repairs. Back up plans for providing temporary signals are in place in the event poles cannot be immediately repaired or replaced. Installing temporary signals could take several days to accomplish depending on a number of on-site factors.

The Division Manager is keeping track of all labor, equipment, parts, materials and contract services in the event we can make a claim to recover damages. Please let me know if I can provide you with any additional information.


