“The City of Broken Arrow is thrilled to be working with Reasor's on this project to setup a drive-through cooking oil recycle station,” said Lauren Wilson, Pretreatment Coordinator. “We want people to get into the habit of recycling their used cooking oil at the same time they're buying milk at the grocery store.”

Cooking oil should NOT be poured down the kitchen sink. This causes residential grease blockages, which is one of the main causes of sewer overflows and backups. Cleaning up the environment and homes after sewer overflows and backups is very costly for taxpayers.

Though clearly this is from Loretta, Ray was the one who suggested I write this letter on behalf of the two of us. We hope that you pay them very well and that you'll share with them our heartfelt respect and gratitude.
